For those of us in the Borough office, all eyes are on the annual budget. I encourage all residents to look at the draft budgets when they are published on the Borough's website and to

come to Council meetings during budget discussions. This is an excellent opportunity to observe and even participate in one of the core functions of local government.

On the fun side of the Borough, we have family friendly activities to look forward to. The annual Hayride will be on Oct. 11 and Light Up the Hills on Nov. 15. Share Your Favorite Forest Hills Trees



Our featured tree is recognized by all Forest Hills residents — the Pin Oak (Quercus palustris). These magnificent trees are found in every neighborhood and shade many of our streets. Because of their size, they may lower temperatures by 7 to 9 degrees Fahrenheit.

The Pin Oak pictured here is 10 feet, 10 inches in circumference and towers above neighboring trees. In addition to the way Pin Oaks contribute to our quality of life, Oaks support wildlife by offering habitat and shelter. Bird lover? Pin Oaks support over 500 species of insects that form an essential part of the food chain.

Concern: Pin Oaks are under threat from Oak Wilt, an incurable fungal disease. It is spread through insects attracted to wounds such as pruning cuts, especially from April through October. For any tree, consulting a certified arborist for maintenance services is best.

Dog Obedience

Cardio Kickboxing. Classes are formatted for all fitness levels and modifications are available for anyone with injuries or physical limitations. Please bring a mat, water, small towel and a great attitude to class! The Fall Session (10 Weeks) will take place on Tuesdays, Sept. 9 to Nov. 18 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Pool Lodge. Since Forest Hills became a member of Bird Town PA this May, things have really taken flight. With the help of many gracious community volunteers, Bird Town committee members planted the first neighborhood pollinator garden at Ryan Glen Park.

Want to create your own pollinator garden? Enroll in the Audubon Certified Backyard Habitat program. The Audubon Society of Western PA (ASWP) designed this program to connect you with the resources needed to make your yard a sanctuary for nesting and overwintering birds, and a recharging station for migrating birds.

After moving to Forest Hills five years ago, Brett Russell and Melissa Brown wanted to make some improvements to their garden space and decided that creating an Audubon

Certified Backyard Habitat was the way to go. They are thrilled that they did! Both describe the initial consultation as very positive and encouraging. They like that they were not asked to take out existing plants but were rather given suggestions for adding beneficial plants that suited their yard. They also appreciate that they were able to make additions at their own pace. Now, Melissa says, they have a beautiful ecosystem in their yard that they love watching every day and they are excited to continue to add to their creation.

If you choose to enroll in the program, ASWP will arrange a visit to your property. After that, you will receive a customized report, including plant recommendations. ASWP provides ample support and resources, and as you make your improvements, you will be rewarded with the arrival of new birds and pollinators. Your backyard will become part of a larger network of habitats that becomes a network of mini-nature reserves and makes an important difference for our environment.
