HOW WE CAN HELP:

Safe Monroe provides FREE & CONFIDENTIAL services to anyone affected by domestic and sexual abuse – of any sexual orientation, gender identity, age, economic status or cultural background – in the Monroe County area.

24/7 CRISIS HOTLINE

Our hotline is available 24/7, including holidays, to anyone who needs help: *victims*, *survivors*, *their families and friends*, *and professionals* who seek information about how they might better meet the needs of their clients.



*Our hotline is available in both English and Spanish, as well as in other languages, via a translator line.

COUNSELING:

Our counseling services embrace the empowerment philosophy, with a trauma-informed and survivor-centered approach. Spanish speaking counselors are available.

Counselors Assist In:

- Safety Planning
- Establishing Personal Goals
- Living Independently & Free From Violence

*Although all our counselors are trained in all aspects of abuse, we have counselors specializing in Sexual Abuse and Child Survivors.

EMERGENCY SHELTER:

We provide free, confidential emergency shelter in a communal living safe house for anyone who is fleeing abuse and needs a temporary safe place to live.

Shelter residents have access to our free and confidential services including counseling, safety planning, employment resources, housing information, and legal advocacy.

LEGAL ADVOCACY:

Our legal advocates help victims navigate their way through the legal system, and accompany victims of domestic and sexual abuse during Protection From Abuse (PFA) hearings, Magisterial District Justice hearings, and trials.

They also provide support, encouragement, and information about available options and resources.

MEDICAL ADVOCACY:

Trained Safe Monroe counselor/advocates are available to meet victims of domestic and sexual abuse at medical facilities in Monroe County to provide support during medical examinations, as well as information about available options and resources.

PREVENTION EDUCATION:

Through our Prevention Education and community awareness programs, we provide free prevention education programs to schools, churches and other community organizations to raise awareness and educate the public about the issues of domestic and sexual abuse.

WHAT IS DOMESTIC ABUSE?

Domestic abuse is a pattern of *coercive behavior* used by one person to gain *power and control* over another in an intimate or familial relationship.

WHAT IS SEXUAL ABUSE?

Sexual abuse, also commonly referred to as sexual violence, includes any type of *forced*, *coerced* or *non-consenting* sexual contact including unwanted sexual touching, oral sex, rape, harassment and more.
