Ready for Winter Checklist:

- Inspect your heating system.
- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Clean gutters and downspouts.
- Seal drafts around doors and windows.
- Protect outdoor plumbing. Disconnect garden hoses.
- Inspect your roof. Replace missing or damaged shingles.
- Service your fireplace or wood stove. Have chimneys cleaned and inspected.
- Stock up on winter supplies. Snow shovels, ice melt, flashlights, batteries, bottled water, and non-perishable food.
- Prepare your vehicles. Check tires, battery, windshield wipers, and antifreeze levels.
- Know your utility shutoffs. Water, gas, and electricity.

PENN WASTE INFORMATION:

Trash and Recycling pickup day
is **TUESDAY**

Large Item-1 per week (confirm with Penn Waste that you have large item for pick-up)

If your collection day falls on a weekday holiday, your collection day moves forward one day. If the holiday falls on a weekend, your collection day will not change.

Place waste curbside by 5 AM.

Containers may not exceed 60 lbs.

Large items that are too heavy to be lifted by two people will not be accepted.

No construction debris will be collected curbside.

LIMITATIONS

- Tires limited to 2 per household and must be removed from rims
- Carpets must be bundled into 4' rolls
- Gas- or diesel-powered equipment must have fuel and oil removed
- Mattresses limited to 2 per household
- Appliances must be empty



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LITHIUM BATTERY DISPOSAL:



Do Not Put Rechargeable Batteries in your trash or recycling bin! If you own a cellphone or power tool, you own a rechargeable battery.

While convenient, rechargeable batteries require proper disposal when they are no longer usable.

Conventional disposal of these types of batteries in your trash pickup can cause problems!

Trash is compacted both in the garbage truck and at the waste facility. When subjected to intense pressure these batteries combust and ignite causing fires in the garbage trucks or at the facility.

Rechargeable batteries are also unsafe to put in your recycling bin.

REPORTING DEAD DEER:

If you notice a dead deer along a township road, please report it as soon as possible so it can be removed promptly.

When reporting a dead deer, call the township with the following information:

- The **road name/address** where the deer is located.
- The **intersection** to help identify the exact location.
- Whether the deer is **on the roadway, shoulder, or in your yard**.

For your safety, never attempt to move a dead deer yourself.

ELECTRONIC DISPOSAL/RECYCLING:

Some electronics cannot be disposed of in the trash due to the toxic metals they contain. Residents can take electronics to either of the following recycling locations:

WINTER TRASH COLLECTION REMINDERS:



Winter weather is on the way! To help ensure safe and efficient trash collection during snow and ice events please follow the following reminders:

- **Use Dark-Colored Trash Bags** – Dark-colored bags are easier for collection crews to see against snow-covered ground.
- **Provide Clear Access** – Make sure there is a safe, clear path to your trash and recycling bags or containers. Remove snow and ice from around your collection area whenever possible.
- **Be Patient** – Severe weather may delay collection. Your trash and recycling may not be picked up at the usual time, so please leave your containers at the curb until they have been collected.
- **Slow Down Around Collection Trucks** – If you are driving near a trash or recycling truck, reduce your speed before passing. Watch carefully for collection workers and oncoming traffic.
- **Stay Alert While Driving** – Keep your eyes on the road, avoid distractions, and allow extra following distance between vehicles during winter weather.
