Cumberland Township processes various applications daily for our residents with the assistance of our partners. Hopefully to make it easier for our residents, our partner, PMCA, will be at our campus located at 1370 Fairfield Road on Tuesdays from 8am to 3pm. You can confirm they are here before stopping by visiting our website or Savvy Citizen. PMCA Gettysburg office is still available Monday through Friday from 9am to 3pm. PMCA is located at 1895B York Road Gettysburg PA, 17325. They are accessible by phone at 717-496-4996 and have an after-hour drop box.

From the Maintenance Department...



The summer season is a busy time of year for the Cumberland Township Maintenance Crew; we have a full calendar for this year's project season with in-house and contracted work scheduled.

We have completed various storm water pipe replacements and waterway swale improvements on Russell Tavern Road to improve drainage along the roadway. Also on Russell Tavern Road, we widened the intersection at Mummasburg Road to allow truck and agricultural traffic to navigate the intersection safely.

Various contracted projects are being completed including Seal Coats and Fog Seals on Belmont, Russell Tavern, Miller, Breems Hill and Herrs Ridge Roads along with Paddock Drive. This is a two-part process that begins with a seal coat and is finished off with a fog seal to lock the top layer of aggregate for a durable wearing surface. Also slated to be completed in the upcoming season is a Cape Seal application on Park Avenue and Kinsey Drive, similar to the seal coats, this is also a two part process starting with a chip seal to seal any cracks in the existing surface followed by a slurry seal on top to finish the wearing surface and provide durable roadway. Lastly, on Skyline Court and Tiffany Lane, we will be using a process called Ultra-Thin Bonded Wearing Course. This process resembles standard paving processes and will reprofile the roadways to help with drainage which will provide a dependable wearing surface.



The crew has also been working diligently to assist in moving the administration and police department back to 1370 Fairfield Road, along with this we have been finishing up the final improvements to the campus parking lot including upgrading stormwater pipe and structures and finishing the resurfacing project later this season.

Roadside mowing is a big part of our summer maintenance work. Mowing not only makes the roads look nice but also improves visibility along the roads and intersections and helps keep vegetation from encroaching on the facilities within the right-of-way. As you encounter our mowing crew, please use caution and give the operator enough space to work safely before navigating around them.

In addition to these projects, we will be preparing for future projects in various areas of the Township. These include replacing and upgrading storm sewer piping and base repairs in areas that may have been damaged from winter weather or excessive heavy traffic. Upgrading various traffic signs is also on the list for the summer/fall projects. This is being done to help upgrade reflectivity and allow the motoring public to navigate around our roadways.

We will also continue to map our stormwater infrastructure, this process allows us to track our inventory and create a maintenance schedule for cleaning, replacements and upgrades. You may see the guys traversing throughout your development locating, inspecting and documenting the infrastructure system with GIS survey equipment.

These summer projects are completed with help from our Maintenance Staff along with our multi-municipal group which includes Gettysburg Borough, Mount Pleasant, Straban and Franklin Townships.

As always, have a safe and enjoyable Summer Season!

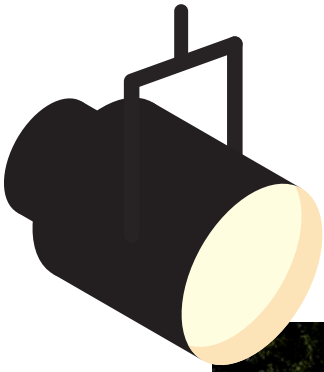

Retiree Spotlight

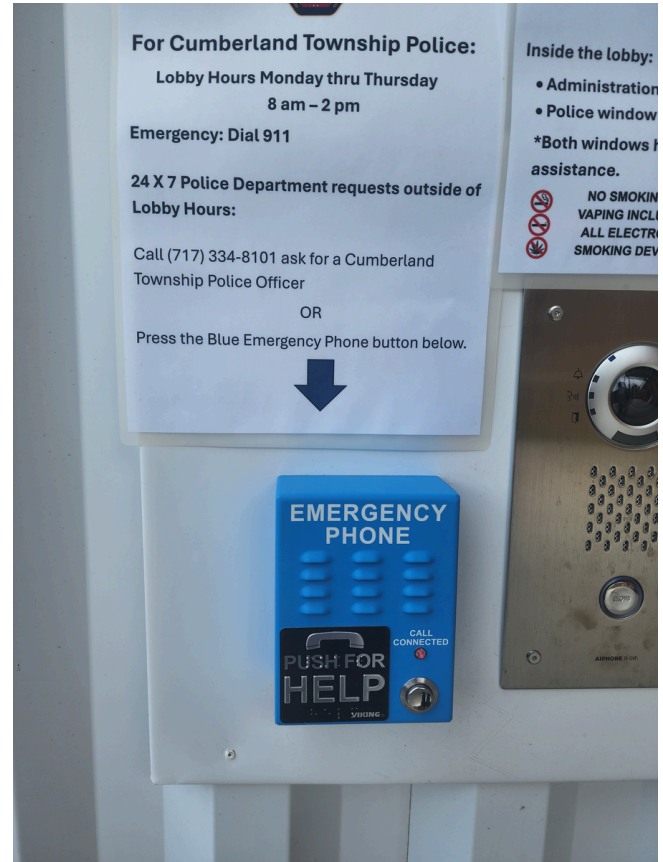
Retired Lieutenant Tim Guise

Residents are required to bring identification and a copy of your Waste Connections invoice / statement for proper identification.



Adams County Conservation District Vector Control



Hello residents and neighbors in Adams County,

My name is Madison Lang, I serve as your local Vector Control Coordinator. As we get into the 2026 summer season I wanted to take a moment to introduce myself and share some helpful tips to stay safe from ticks & mosquitoes. Whether you're outside taking a walk, enjoying the fresh air, gardening, or vacationing, it is always important to stay aware of these unwelcome pests. While one bite may not seem like a big deal, these pests can carry and pass on dangerous diseases to pets and people alike. The good news is that there are several preventative measures you can take to reduce the risk of exposure to these vectors.

My job within Adams County is to prevent the nuisance and disease spread by monitoring vector populations. Throughout the season I work to coordinate community prevention and enact control measures when necessary. I encourage residents to help prevent bites and disease spread by eliminating vector habitat such as stagnant water, leaf litter, and tall grass throughout your property. It is always easier to prevent bites by eliminating the source directly through dumping water, drilling holes in containers/buckets, removing leaf litter, mowing grass, or treating still water with mosquito dunks.

You can also protect yourself by wearing EPA approved bug repellent containing DEET or picaridin. Wearing tucked long sleeves, pants, and close toed shoes can also prevent vectors from biting. After spending time outside always ensure to conduct a tick check on you, your loved ones, and your pets. If a tick is found, remove it as soon as possible with tweezers pulling upward with steady pressure. After a bite, ensure to monitor for symptoms such as a fever, rash, body aches, or nausea and vomiting. Seek medical attention immediately if any of these symptoms arise.

Storm Water News

Landscaping



Let your flower garden water you!

An article in the spring newsletter introduced rain barrels as a summertime source of water for your landscaping needs. But your landscaping can also help provide you with water!

Consider a summer thunderstorm. A heavy rain which follows a dry spell is only helpful if the water can be captured and remain where it falls without causing flooding and erosion. Once it runs off our land, it travels somewhere else and is “lost” for our immediate needs.

Ideally, precipitation soaks into the ground (infiltration) and replenishes our groundwater. Groundwater supplies about 80% of the water used by the population of Adams County. Without going into specifics, the geology of our area isn’t as helpful for infiltration as it could be. One way we can improve the situation is by slowing down the water and giving it more time to soak in. Hence your garden.

A garden which is designed to capture and temporarily hold stormwater runoff is called a rain garden. In addition to reducing runoff and improving groundwater supplies, rain gardens improve water quality as the water is filtered through the soil, they provide food and habitat for insect pollinators, and they beautify your yard.

A rain garden should be constructed in a bowl shape with a flat bottom to allow for water collection and storage. The size of your garden should depend on the area which will drain to it and the amount of precipitation which may fall on that area during a storm. For the garden to work efficiently, the soil may need some adjustments to obtain an appropriate infiltration rate. Rain gardens should not hold water for longer than 48 hours.

Here are a few tips if you are considering a rain garden:

- Clay soil will infiltrate water very slowly while sandy soil infiltrates quickly.
- A soil test can help you identify the type of soil you have. Kits are available in the Penn State Extension Office at the Ag & Natural Resources Center in Gettysburg.

Avoid planting a rain garden on a slope of more than 10%, in a spot which remains wet for more than a couple of days, under a tree, over buried utilities, and where overflow may damage a sidewalk, driveway, or other infrastructure.

- Use PA One Call at 8-1-1 or 800-242-1776 before you dig to learn where your utilities are located.
- Stay at least 10 feet away from your foundation, 50 ft from your septic system, and 100ft from your well.
- Hand digging (if possible) will prevent additional soil compaction. Compaction slows down infiltration.
- The ideal ponding depth for a rain garden is 4-8 inches. Avoid greater than 12 inches.
- Rock inlets and outlets will help reduce erosion in these high flow areas.
- Use native plants in your garden. Their deeper roots will help the water soak in.
- Plant multiples of a few different species. Too many species can make the garden less attractive and harder to maintain.
- Mulch should only be used during the initial planting and be no more than 3 inches deep.

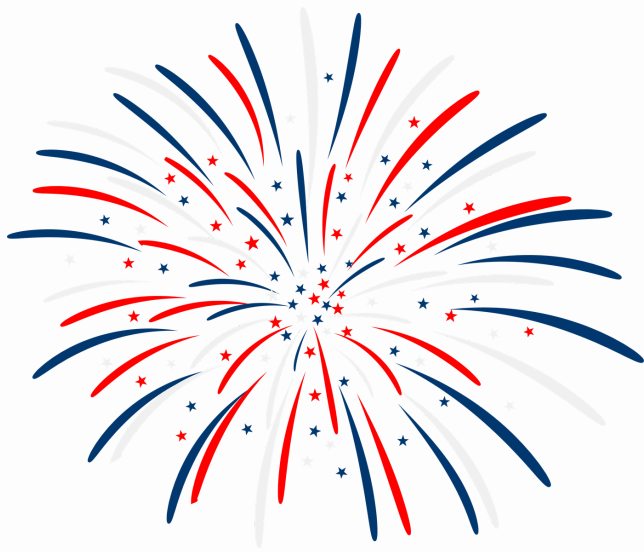

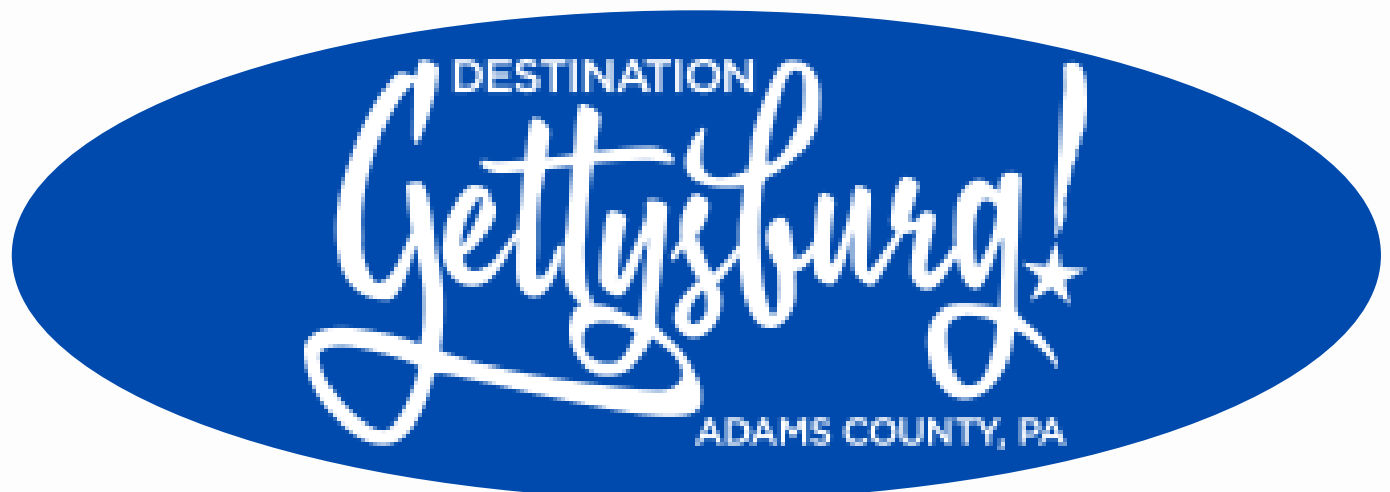

RECYCLING BALER

Adams Rescue Mission has served as Adams County's main source of recycling for over 50 years. Since 2003, our industrial recycling baler has played a vital role not only in caring for our community and environment, but also in transforming lives through our restoration program. More than just a machine, the baler has provided meaningful vocational training and hands-on work experience for the men and women in our program, helping them build skills, purpose, and a pathway toward a more stable future.

Since November 2023, our industrial recycling baler — which faithfully served Adams County for over 20 years — has been out of service. This machine once generated nearly \$300,000 annually for Adams Rescue Mission while also providing valuable vocational training opportunities for our Resident Guests. Since its loss, our recycling revenue has dropped to approximately \$130,000 per year, and we can no longer efficiently process plastics.

While smaller balers help us continue serving the community, they cannot match the efficiency, environmental impact, or revenue potential of a full industrial baler. A new baler would allow us to greatly increase recycling capacity, reduce transportation emissions, restore lost revenue, and expand hands-on job training opportunities for the men and women in our program.

Today, we are facing an urgent need to replace our baler. The cost of a new industrial baler is approximately \$500,000. Through opioid recovery funds, \$225,000 has already been secured, and Adams Rescue Mission is prepared to finance an additional \$100,000 if necessary. We are now asking our community to come together once again to help raise the remaining \$175,000 needed to restore this critical program that supports both environmental stewardship and life-changing restoration for individuals in Adams County.

The baler is more than a machine — it provides meaningful work experience, teaches valuable job skills, helps build resumes, and gives our Resident Guests a renewed sense of purpose as they work toward stability and independence.

Every donation — large or small — helps us continue recycling for Adams County while providing life-changing opportunities for the men and women in our program. Together, we can invest not only in equipment, but in restoration, dignity, hope, and a better planet.

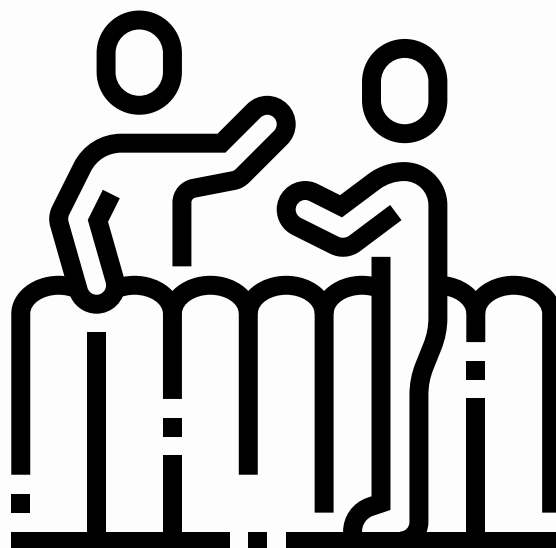
