SPRING/SUMMER REMINDERS

This is the time of year especially to think about the safety of your home. Clean your dryer vents and lint traps. Test all your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and install fresh batteries. It is a good idea to keep a fire extinguisher in the home. They should also be tested to make sure they are properly charged. Clean gutters, drains, and downspouts to avoid wet basements.

The Growing Season is upon us. Keep your lawn mowed no higher than 10 inches and weeds under control. Keep shrubs and trees pruned back away from streets and sidewalks. Bag your clippings for trash day. Please don't dump them over hills or in empty lots! Swissvale Garbage will take most rubbish (within reason) but NO items with electric cords or gas. No paint or noxious liquids.

Trash is to be placed out no earlier than 24 hours before garbage day. Empty cans must be removed from the street/sidewalk no later than 24 hours after pickup. ALL trash must be bagged, even in cans, and placed at the curb.

Dumpsters require a permit. If you are planning to acquire a dumpster you must obtain a permit. Dumpster permits are free for the first 30 days if the dumpster is located on private property (driveway) and \$30 per month after the first 30 days. Dumpsters placed on public property (street) require both a permit and a \$30 per month fee. Contact the Borough Office at 412-823-6500 to obtain a permit prior to acquiring a dumpster.

All Borough streets are designated as public parking. No one is entitled to a specific parking space unless handicapped. Contact the Borough Office to see about handicap parking. DO NOT block resident sidewalks, driveways, or parking pads. Parking on sidewalks is prohibited. Vehicles parked on Borough streets exhibiting expired stickers, no plates, or deemed inoperable are subject to tickets and/or tow.

Chalfant has a noise ordinance between the hours of 10 pm. and 6 am. Also a 9:45 pm curfew for minors under 18 (some exceptions).

Our Borough park is open from dawn to dusk. Be respectful of handicap parking at the park. Again...NO dogs permitted in the park. There are trash cans available for your refuse.

REDD UP DAY

This year our annual clean up day is on April 26th. If you would like to volunteer, please meet at the Community Center, North Ave. at 10:00 a.m. Gloves and trash bags will be provided.

EASTER EGG HUNT

Borough Council and Crime Watch are sponsoring this year's Easter Egg Hunt which will be held on April 12th from 1:00 pm. to 3:00 pm. at the Chalfant Community Center. This fun afternoon will feature entertainment, prizes, a fire truck and a visit from the EASTER BUNNY!! Refreshments provided. The egg hunt starts promptly at 1:00. Don't be late! See you there.



FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR

*Upcoming tax deadlines for Chalfant Borough property owners:

3rd installment payment of the 2024 Woodland Hills School tax is due on March 31, 2025.

According to the Allegheny County website, the "discount" deadline for your County taxes is April 30, 2025. This was extended from March 31, 2025.

The Chalfant Borough 2025 taxes paid at discount are due April 30, 2025.

The 2025 Woodland Hills School taxes will be mailed on July 1, 2025.

*Home owners who qualify for the Homestead Exclusion:

If you own your home and reside in your home, you may qualify for the Homestead Exclusion which will reduce your Allegheny County and Woodland Hills School taxes. This form is available from me or on the Allegheny County website. Form for exclusion for tax year 2026 must be filed by March 1, 2026. It is better to file around December or January 2026 to be sure the exclusion gets applied before the issuing of tax bills. Only properties where the owner of that property resides on a permanent basis. *Questions regarding adding and or eliminating names on a deed:

Anytime you need to make a change to your property deed, whether removing a deceased spouse, adding a child's name or any other changes to your original deed, you must contact a lawyer for the proper steps to achieve this objective. The Tax Collector cannot be of any legal assistance to such transactions.

PROPERTY TAX OR RENT REBATE PROGRAM Every year the State offers a Property Tax or Rent Rebate program for monies paid the previous year. This year's claim period is for 2024. The PA1000 form can be downloaded and printed off the State website or obtained at Representative Salisbury's office in Braddock. The Maximum Standard Income Level is \$46,520 per household and the filing deadline is June 30, 2025. See form for more detailed instructions.

MY FAVORITE EASTER MEAL	
Baked ham (cold or warm)	Kielbasa with Lemon
Paska	Easter Cheese

***Easter Cheese (cirak, sirecz, hrudka) Recipe	
Sweet	Savory
12 large eggs	12 large eggs
1 quart whole milk	1 quart whole milk
³ ⁄ ₄ cup white sugar	salt and pepper to taste
1 Tbsp vanilla	1 tsp vanilla
Dash of nutmeg	

Beat eggs until well mixed. Transfer to a double boiler; stir in milk and other ingredients. Cook over medium heat for 30 minutes or so constantly stirring with a slotted metal spoon to prevent scorching.

When the mixture looks like cooked scrambled eggs pour it carefully into a cheesecloth lined colander. Carefully gather the ends of the cheesecloth in your hands and pull them together until the cheese forms into a ball. Tie the cheesecloth tightly at the top of the ball. Tie the loose ends over a faucet and let the whey drip off for at least 3 hours. Untie the cheesecloth and wrap the ball in plastic wrap and refrigerate. It will keep at least a week. Slice to serve.

***Horseradish and Beets recipe
3-15 oz. cans plain beets (drained and chopped fine)
6 oz. jarred horseradish
1 Tbsp brown sugar
¼ tsp salt
1 tsp white vinegar
Dash of garlic powder and black pepper Blend all ingredients. Serve as a condiment. Refrigerate.

***Kielbasa with Lemon recipe

12-14 oz. pkg of your favorite Polska Kielbasa

2 lemons (or more to taste)

Cut the Kielbasa into "coin" sized pieces. Transfer to a saute pan. Squeeze lemons and add juice to Kielbasa. You can also add sliced leftover lemons to the pan. Saute until nicely caramelized. If desired, add another squeeze of lemon before serving.
