Pavement Preservation Project on Various Routes in South Central PA to Continue on I-81, I-83

Harrisburg, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that a districtwide pavement preservation project is set to continue this month on Interstate 81 in Franklin County and Interstate 83 in York County.

Weather permitting, work will resume on I-81 in the northbound lanes between Exit 14 (Route 316/Wayne Avenue) and Exit 20 (Route 997/Scotland) in Franklin County. The contractor will work from 9:00 PM to 6:00 AM tonight and Sunday, October 6. There will be lane restrictions.

Once this work is completed, the contractor will work on I-83 in York County from Exit 28 (Route 297/Strinestown/Zions View) to Exit 33 (Route 392/Yocumtown). The contractor will work from 9:00 PM to 6:00 AM Monday, October 7, and then the following week Sunday, October 13, through Tuesday, October 15. There will be lane restrictions in both directions of I-83.

In addition, the contractor will begin work at 7:00 AM Thursday, October 10, to repair a section of Route 74 (York Road) along the Yellow Breeches Creek just south of the intersection with Creek Road near the railroad crossing in Monroe Township, Cumberland County. Flaggers will assist alternating traffic in a single lane.

Following this work, the contractor will relocate to I-83 in southern York County from the Pennsylvania-Maryland State Line to Exit 4 (Route 851/Shrewsbury). The contractor will work from 7:00 PM to 5:00 AM Monday, October 21, through Thursday, October 24. There will be lane restrictions in both directions of I-83.

This project consists of concrete patching, crack sealing and other on call services for sinkhole repair and roadway repairs, along with other miscellaneous construction on various routes in the PennDOT District 8 region consisting of Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry and York counties.

New Enterprise Stone and Lime Company, Inc., of New Enterprise, PA, is the contractor on this \$1,510,000 project. All work on this contract is expected to be completed by July 1, 2026.
