

### Widespread Plowable Snowfall Tuesday

December 1, 2025 6:00 AM EST

Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025


Next Update: By 6 PM Monday 12/1/2025

#### **Key Messages**

- A coastal low will bring accumulating snow for much of central Pennsylvania and possibly a mix of precipitation types for the Laurels and southeast of I-81 tonight into Tuesday.
- A widespread 2+ inches of snowfall is likely across the state on Tuesday; accumulations of 6+ inches are possible east of US-15.
- Travel conditions for the morning commute on Tuesday will likely be hazardous; consider delaying or postponing travel.

# What Has Changed / Important Forecast Updates:

- Winter Weather Advisories issued for most of the area.
- → Winter Storm Watch remains in effect where 6"+ snowfall is possible; upgrade decisions to be made later today as confidence increases.



### **Current Watches, Warnings, and Advisories**

Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025



Current Watches, Warnings, and Advisories



- A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect late tonight through early Tuesday afternoon for nearly all of Pennsylvania where a plowable (2"+) snowfall is expected.
- A Winter Storm Watch remains in effect for east-central and northeastern PA, where snowfall totals could reach 6" (Warning upgrade possible later today)






## **Snow Start and End Timing - Tuesday**

Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025



 Onset Time: Snow will begin after midnight Monday night, accumulating first in the NW mountains, then spreading into the Laurels in the late night, and eastward across all of central PA by 6-7 AM.




• End Time: Snow may transition to rain across southeast PA Tuesday morning; precipitation will end quickly from west to east during the late morning to early afternoon on Tuesday.






### **Snow and Ice Forecast - Tuesday**

#### Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025



- A widespread plowable snowfall is expected Tuesday.
- In general, higher elevations will receive more snowfall.
- The heaviest snow is expected east of US-15, where 1"+ per hour snowfall rates are most likely.




- Some freezing rain may mix in across the Laurels tonight into early Tuesday morning.
- Snow may transition to or mix with freezing rain/sleet/rain between I-81 and the PA-MD border on Tuesday.





### **Boom or Bust Scenarios**

Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025




- PA could see lower totals than forecast as heaviest snow transitions from northwest PA late tonight to southeast PA early Tuesday morning.
- Boom Potential: Some of the heaviest snow will likely fall just north of the rain-snow line, from Harrisburg north to Williamsport and points east. This corridor could see locally higher totals than currently forecast.
  - Rain Possible: There will likely be a transition from snow or a wintry mix to rain between I-81 and the PA-MD border on Tuesday. In this case, lower-end snowfall totals would be observed.



### Winter Storm Severity Index

Monday Night - Tuesday December 1-2, 2025



- With snow arriving before dawn on Tuesday, expect delays and disruptions for the Tuesday morning commute.
- Plan extra time or consider delaying/postponing travel.
- Disruptions to travel could be more significant because it will be the first plowable snowfall of the season for parts of the area.
