April 15, 2025

The work session was called to order by Chairman William Weimer at 6:00pm in the Coolbaugh Township Municipal Center located at 5520 Municipal Drive, Tobyhanna, PA.

1. Discussion on Act 537 Update (Eric Trembly)

- Door-to-Door Survey
- Township Boundary Edge Conditions and how they affect Sewer Service

Eric Trembley from ATLAS was in attendance reviewing the status of the Act 537 plan for the Township and reviewed the plans that were discussed at a prior meeting for those Board members that were not in attendance. After reviewing the plans he stated that the next step is to conduct door to door surveys and water sampling for properties that are served by on lot systems. He stated that they must survey 15% of the residents in each area since the Act 537 study is township wide. He stated that he will work with the township and the SEO on this survey and requested that the Township put out a notice when they are knocking door to door so that residents know that it is not a salesperson and in fact someone that is representing the township. Ms. Kelly stated that Tobyhanna Army Depot is an EPA Superfund Site as they have polluted the water in the area and now there are residents that are hooked up to the Army Depot water. She stated that we can give you the area with Mr. Trembly stating that it would be helpful as we probably would not test those properties. Mr. Weimer asked if E-Docs would be an option to obtain permission to test from the residents that are not in the area, with Mr. Trembly stating that he would look into that. Ms. Kelly asked about Sewage Planning Modules and who owns the assets asking if that can be outlined in the plan. He stated that can be outlined in the plan. Solicitor Armstrong stated that we can include it in the Maintenance A Plans and the requirements relating to development with Mr. Trembly stating that he would defer to the Township Engineer on the specifics of properties as there are certain components that address the requirements for the various types of development. Discussion took place about STR's and holding tanks not being permitted for that use. Mr. Weimer asked if he will be able to bring the board the reports of the findings, being advised that he will be bringing two years' worth of reports and findings for the Board to review as well as cost analysis. The Board thanked him for the update and looks forward to working with him on this project.

2. Public Comment

Nate Oiler from RKR Hess reviewed the Messer Agreement stating that the plan added the additional lot which was a condition of the stormwater agreement to tie up loose ends. He stated that this was submitted to the Engineer and the Solicitor, and it was found to address the comments. He thanked the Board for allowing him the two minutes to review the agreement as he has another meeting he needs to attend this evening as well.

Mr. Weimer announced the following:

- Public input will be considered at the beginning of the meeting for non-agenda items. The public will be given an opportunity to speak on each agenda matter.
- The meeting is being recorded to aid in the preparation of the minutes. Please remember to state your name and community or city you reside in before speaking.

1. Public input

- D. Pope stated that there are still tractor trailers on Pope Road and that there is also an issue with trash on Pope Road. Mr. Keane stated that violations have been sent.
- D. Pope asked about the property that is filling in the wetlands and was advised that the MCCD was notified and that they will be going out this week.
- M. Wood stated that the Coolbaugh Township Historical Association will be holding their annual art celebration and would like the Board to come and judge for the Supervisors award on May 8th prior to the meeting.
- J. Miller thanked Mr. Keane for his efforts in getting the old Churnock's taken down, she is very happy it is gone as it was an eye sore.
- M. Schlegel expressed his concerns with the trucks on the Green Road. Mr. Weimer stated that there are
 future plans from Penndot that are planned for Route 196 which include a turning lane onto the Green
 Road. He stated that it will probably cause more problems with the traffic. He stated that the project will be
 completed when they find funding.
- H. Smith expressed his concerns with the traffic for parent drop- off and pick up at the Clear Run Campus and the fact that there is no flashing lights on the road alerting drivers. Mr. Weimer stated that he will contact the school.

2. Approval of minutes / notes:

Ms. Colgan made a motion second by Ms. Kelly to approve the April 1, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented.

3. Monthly Reports

- Pocono Mountain Regional Police Report- Presented by Mr. Weimer; He stated that Chief Wagner has
 opted into the drop program and will retire in June/July 2028. He stated that they are currently upfitting the
 new vehicles. He stated that the pension plan was not doing well but stated that they were going to wait it
 out in hopes that it will end up favorable. Ms. Kelly stated that if it does not it will be up to the
 municipalities to make it up financially.
- **Pocono Mountain Regional EMS Report** Presented by A. Schrader; he stated that they have two trucks coming in and they are hiring for the summer and expanding their hours. He stated that the cost to purchase an ambulance went up 6.5%. He stated that the support from the municipalities is appreciated.
- Coolbaugh Township VFC- Presented by Mr. Keane; he stated that they just finished the Fire Inspector 2 class, and they are currently hosting multiple training sessions which they have invited area fire, police and EMS to attend the classes. He stated that they will be having emergency vehicle driver training with the PMRPD.
- Gouldsboro VFC- Presented by D. Miller, stating that they will have their annual fish fry on Good Friday.
- Pocono Summit VFC- presented by T. Rispoli
- Thornhurst VFC- Presented by D. Serfass; he thanked the Coolbaugh Township VFC for the training opportunities that he and his fire company have attended and will continue to attend. He stated that the training that is held is very beneficial and saves them a lot of money from the cost of travel, food, lodging and fuel that they would have to spend if it was not held locally.

4. Codes and Zoning/Short Term Rental Report

Mr. Keane reviewed the reports provided and the process for permit application and the recycling permit process. He stated that he is going to try to have a report created that shows the punches at the bulk drop offs.

6. Acknowledge the Withdrawal Request for the Subdivision and Land Development Plans for Posh Hospitality (Proposed Chipotle Restaurant)

The Board acknowledged the withdrawal of the Posh Hospitality Subdivision and Land Development Plan for the proposed Chipotle Restaurant.

7. Planning Commission Comments on Pending Applications pursuant to the PC minutes

Discussion took place on the Planning Commission concerns and recommendation for a letter to be sent to applicants with plans that are considered inactive. Solicitor Armstrong reviewed the plan activity for PMCC North Lots 1 and 2, Landston Equities and Northampton Farms. After a lengthy discussion it was agreed that Solicitor Armstrong would send a letter to the applicants to check on the status of the projects. Ms. Masker stated it is her understanding that Landston Equities is planning to submit for the May PC meeting.

o **Discussion:** J. Miller stated that PMCC Lot 1 is in the middle of a DEP Chapter 105 joint permit review period. He stated that the BOS and PC are not aware of this and stated that the developer should be sharing this information with the township. He stated that the only reason he is aware of the process is through filing RTK requests. Solicitor Armstrong stated that he will confirm that the Township Engineer is receiving this information and any DEP correspondence. He stated that this is an outside agency approval and is a condition of approval. J. Miller stated that lot 2 is in litigation and stated that the developers knew what they were doing when they submitted the plan and now are in litigation and the plan is not going anywhere.

Dear Erin,

On April 25, 2025, Coolbaugh Township/KCE received bids via PennBid for the Municipal Bldg #3 Step Replacement Project. There were two (2) bids received ranging from \$82,745.00 (Base Bid plus Alternate #1) to \$116,793.00 (Base Bid plus Alternate #1). The apparent low bidder was Kobalt Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$82,745.00 as shown in the attached Bid Tabulation.

After reviewing the Bids, we recommend that Coolbaugh Township reject all bids as the bid prices were significantly higher than the 2025 budget amount. We also recommend that the Township consider re-bidding the project, potentially separating the handrail work from the concrete work. The Township should also consider grant opportunities to assist in funding this project.
