Most scams will target any vulnerabilities you have playing on emotions and rushing you to take an action, usually, making a payment.

Auto-Renewal Scams—“Your car warranty is expiring”

Business and Job Opportunities—“Get rich quick,” work-from-home, mystery shopping, payment processing, envelope stuffing, etc.

Cryptocurrency—Invest in bitcoin for large returns, paying for warrants with bitcoin.

Contractor—Falsely claim to be licensed, certified or insured, estimates not in writing, poor workmanship and refusing to fix, large upfront deposits, fake contracts, taking money without performing any work, only accepting cash, ask you to get required building permits, suggest you borrow money from a lender they know.

Family Emergency Scams—Pretending to be a doctor or law enforcement to mimic voices and saying family member needs help.

Government Imposter—Pretending to be with the IRS, Social Security, Medicare, Jury Duty, the state, local government, or law enforcement asking for money.

Health Insurance Scam—Around open enrollment, scammers will call, place ads, and send mail for discounts on health plans for Medicaid, Medicare, or private insurance and rush you into a decision. Call U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) to verify any potential scams.

Immigration Scams—Notarios (notary publics) in the USA are NOT attorneys and cannot provide legal advice. You should NEVER pay for immigration forms and don't sign any blank forms. Only use lawyers from American Immigration Lawyers Association and American Immigration Council.

Moving Scams—Typically new to the area, may not have a website or Google or Yelp reviews. May use cold calling, door-to-door solicitation, or use Craigslist or Facebook Marketplace to get business.

Rental Scams—Ads are on Craigslist or Facebook Marketplace for rental homes. Home may actually be for sale but under a false realtor or property manager name.

Romance Scams—Typically contact with someone from another state or foreign country who spends a lot of time making you think they are interested in you. They ask you for money, pay for travel expenses, or medical bills. They always make up reasons they can't meet up or ask for PIN codes, bank account numbers, gift cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency, and payment through Venmo and Zelle. Do a reverse image search of the person's profile picture to see if it's associated with other names but beware new images can be made using Artificial Intelligence.

Subscription Scams—Unexpectedly receiving a magazine in the mail and a letter asking to pay your monthly agreed-upon fee making it sound like you ordered it.

Timeshare Scams—Luring people into sales pitch with promises of free vacations and other “gifts.” The value is oversold and accessibility is minimized. Sometimes fake properties are used. They may also promise to resell your timeshare with exaggerated speed and price.

Zoning Department

Clear Sight at Intersections (clear sight triangles)

Just a reminder that bushes and trees need to be kept trimmed at street intersections for safety of clear sight. The clear sight triangle is a triangular shaped portion of land at the intersections of streets in which nothing may be constructed, placed, planted, or allowed to grow so that it limits the view of motorists entering or leaving the intersection.

If you have plantings at an intersection, please keep them trimmed back so as not to cause a visibility problem for traffic. If the Township gets a complaint we may come and trim the trees or shrubs, which may not look the way you prefer.

Friendly Reminder

Parks & Recreation Ordinance § 300-16 states that when walking your pets in or around a recreational area, such as Rexroth Park, all pets are required to be on a leash at all times. Owners shall remove any and all fecal matter deposited by said pet while within the Township recreational facility.

If every resident does their part in keeping our facilities free of pet waste, our residents will all benefit from being able to relax and enjoy themselves while outside.

Commercial SIGNS

Lower Windsor Township requires a building permit for commercial signs (their construction is regulated by the state). Personal, individual, and temporary yard signs do not require a permit. Neither sign is permitted in the street right-of-way or blocking the sight line of traffic.

Hiring a Contractor?

Once you hire a contractor, but at least 3 weeks before work is scheduled to begin, the homeowner or the contractor must apply for a permit. Building permits can take up to 15 business days because they are reviewed by a third party (Commonwealth Code Inspection Service, Inc).

If the contractor applies for the permit, the homeowner **must** still post the permit card in the window of the residence/building. If the contractor does not get a permit, the property owner is still legally responsible.

If you have a question as to whether a permit is needed for the work that is to be done or if you have a problem with the actual permit, please call the Zoning Officer, Monica Love, at (717)244-6813.

Lower Windsor Township requires permits for many types of construction and building work. Some jobs require only a "Zoning Permit" and other jobs will require a "Building Permit." These are separate permits which now use the same application form.

Zoning permits fall under Township rules and Ordinances. Building Permits are governed by the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and will require inspections during the work. Zoning Permits are issued within 10 business days; Building Permits require 15 business days.

There is only one permit application to fill out. The permit(s) issued will be Zoning, Building, or both. Each permit has different fee requirements, but both are issued from the Township Office.

Zoning Permits: Carports, garages and sheds NOT attached to your house; porches, patios, paver patios, sidewalks and walkways; decks that are no higher than 30" from the ground, widening a driveway or parking area (whether its new paving or stone). Also, any work performed within the floodplain requires a permit....ANY work.

Building Permits: Home additions of any type, porch roofs or extensions, new doors or windows where the new ones and old ones are different sizes; changes to the structural integrity of the house (exterior walls, floors, roof trusses, beams and the like); installing a wood burning/pellet stove with a chimney, and non-residential, permanent signs.

Some projects require both building and zoning permits; decks over 30" high, demolition of structures, new homes and additions; accessory structures over 1,000 square feet; swimming pools deeper than 24" with or without decks/patios.

As always, stormwater management is required on your lot for ANY and ALL new impervious surfaces (area that no longer allows the rain to seep into the ground). This can be done several different ways which may include rain gardens, seepage beds, or infiltration trenches. All of these can be done by the homeowner and need not be terribly expensive. Call the Zoning Officer with questions.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

Business Registry - Lower Windsor Township is updating the business registry. If you own a business – even a home business, please contact the Zoning Office to update your contact information and registry. Call Monica or Andrea at 717-244-6813 or email mlove@lowerwindsor.com

OLDS (On-Lot Disposal System)

In January of 2026 & again in August 2026, residents in **District 1** were notified that this is the year to have their septic tanks pumped and inspected in accordance with Ordinance 2001-01. **District 1** covers all properties east of Cabin Creek and Cool Creek Roads and north of East Prospect Road and Calvary Church Road. If you received a notice and have not yet had your system pumped/inspected, please do so **by December 31, 2026**. If you did not receive a notice, but think you should have, please contact the Township to verify your address. If you have a holding tank, you must have it pumped yearly. **This is a PA State Mandate, non-compliance WILL result in penalties.**

OLDS (On-Lot Disposal System)

In January of 2027, residents of **District 2** will be notified that this is the year to have their septic tanks pumped and inspected in accordance with Ordinance 2001-01. **District 2** covers all properties east of Prayer Mission and Snyder Corner Roads and south of East Prospect Road and Calvary Church Road. Please have your system pumped and inspected by a pumper/hauler who is registered and licensed by the Township **by Dec 31, 2027**. You can find the list of pumper/haulers on the Township website, or visit the Municipal Office to get a copy. The list may change at the beginning of the year. Please remember, if you have a holding tank, you must have it pumped yearly.

Mailbox reminder to Homeowners

Lower Windsor Township reminds homeowners to prepare mailboxes for winter. Snow that is thrown from plows can damage mailboxes if they are not properly prepared and secured. A properly secured and located mailbox should be able to withstand the force of snow thrown from a plow, even in the worst conditions. Mailboxes should be placed as far from the edge of the road as possible yet still in reach of a mail carrier from a vehicle. Mailboxes are normally placed within the Township's legal right-of-way however, mailbox damage due to snow and not hit directly by the plow or truck is the homeowner's responsibility. **Here are a few tips to help reduce mailbox damage:**

- Place reflective tape on the mailbox to help operators see them at night. When removing snow from around the mailbox, throw snow behind it and not to the sides.
- Make sure the post is in good condition and the box is fastened securely to the post
- If damage was experienced in the past, reconsider the positioning and structure before winter.

For those who follow these tips and still find themselves with a damaged mailbox, they may want to consider a cantilever mailbox support that can swing a mailbox out of harm's way. Plans for such a mailbox are available on PennDOT's website, www.penndot.gov/winter.

Snow Removal Policy 2026

With winter soon approaching, the Highway and Police Departments ask that all residents keep these Township tips in mind during inclement weather.

- Avoid parking along Township roads when snow storms are anticipated. If a road is designated a Snow Emergency Route, vehicles must be removed from the roadway when there is three or more inches of snow expected.
- When a snow emergency is declared, Lower Windsor Township utilizes the major local television stations & Savvy Citizen for resident notification.
- As we receive up-to-date information from the National Weather Service, PennDot, and York County Emergency Management, we will post it to our Savvy Citizen app.
- When clearing your driveway, shovel the snow on the lower side of the driveway so that the plow doesn't push it back into the area you have already shoveled.

Brush Drop-Off

The Township's highway department offers brush drop-off for Lower Windsor Township residents. Proof of residency is required.

The final brush drop-offs for the 2026 calendar year are September 12th & October 10th.

Drop offs are held from 7:00 am to 9:00 am at the LWT Highway Building located at 111 Walnut Valley Court. Signs will designate the drop-off area and employees will be available to assist. We accept brush, limbs, and any wood that is unpainted, untreated, and free of metal. **ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AT ANY OTHER TIME.**

A note about your taxes

If your taxes are escrowed, it is your responsibility to contact your mortgage company to see if they need a copy of your bill. All original tax bills are sent to the homeowner.

If you need a receipt, include the entire copy of your bill (taxpayer copy and tax collector copy) with a self-addressed, stamped envelope. I will stamp and sign the taxpayer copy and return it to you for you to use as a receipt. **If you do not include both copies of your bill with your self-addressed, stamped envelope, no receipt will be returned to you.** This needs to be done for both the county & township bill and the school bills.

I do not accept any personal checks after December 9th. Money orders and cashier's checks can still be mailed or put in the drop box beside the office door up until December 31st. I also accept credit card payments until December 31st. The website is **all-paid.com**. (please note: there is a non-refundable 2.95% fee that goes to the credit card company.) Cash can be brought to the office during office hours until December 31st. I do not recommend sending cash in the mail or putting it in the drop box.

Please put your phone number on all payments. If there is a problem this is the quickest and easiest way for me to get in touch with you!!!

Everyone in the township over the age of 18 and under the age of 65 is legally required to pay a school per capita tax. (some exceptions apply). If you have anyone in your household that is not receiving one, please contact me at my office.
