A series of powerful storms moved through York County last night. Met-Ed is fully engaged in its storm response and will be working diligently to restore every customer as quickly and safely as possible.

All line and forestry crews are active in the region and significant progress has already been made. As of 8:00pm last night, there were over 12,000 customers without power in the York area and over 9,100 in the Hanover area. Currently, there are approximately 5,700 customers without power in the York area and 3,600 in the Hanover area.

Access to certain areas has proved challenging, along with addressing the large number of damaged poles, lines, and equipment. At this time, we do not have global or local Estimated Restoration Times (ETR) available. I will be keeping everyone updated as more information becomes available.
