Sign Structure Inspections Planned on Routes in Dauphin and Cumberland Counties

Mobile operation will require lane or shoulder restrictions

Harrisburg, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that a contractor is scheduled to inspect sign structures on Interstate 83, Interstate 283 and Route 322 in Dauphin County, and I-83 in Cumberland County.

Weather permitting, this work will be performed from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM of the following days:

- Monday, December 2, through Thursday, December 5,
- Monday, December 16, through Thursday, December 19, and
- Monday, January 6, 2025.
- Make up days are scheduled for January 7-9, 2025.

Work will begin on I-83 in Dauphin County with signs structures being inspected in both direction between Interstate 81 and Union Deposit Road from Monday, December 2, to Wednesday, December 4.

Inspection activities will then move to Route 322, Interstate 83 and Interstate 283 in the area of the Eisenhower Interchange in Dauphin County. This work will be performed Thursday, December 5, and Monday, December 16.

After that, the contractor will inspect signs on I-83 from 17th Street in Dauphin County to the bridge spanning Yellow Breeches Creek in Cumberland County north of Exit 40 (Limekiln Road). This work will be performed Tuesday, December 17 through Thursday, December 19, and Monday, January 6, 2025.

Make up days are set for Tuesday, January 7, through Thursday, January 9.

All work is weather dependent.

This will be a mobile operation that will require lane restrictions in the areas where the contractor is working. Up to two right or left lanes will be closed at a time. However, most of the work will require a single left or right lane closure only. Some of the work will be on the shoulders.

Travelers are reminded to be alert for these operations, to obey work zone signs, and to use caution when driving through work zones for their safety, as well as for the safety of the road crews.
