Wyoming Area Regional Police responded to a total of **94** calls in Wyoming for the month of July.

Chief gave report: Fatal accident involving a motorcycle at the Midway Shopping Center. It is under investigation.

He stated it is a great idea to regionalize the fire departments.

WARP held its first FBI teen academy at the new facility, no local kids in attendance. He said it was a success and the kids loved it.

Reported on the damage to the park cameras, the borough will receive restitution for cameras.

Patrol has been beefed up due to motor vehicle theft in the area.

Submitted a cop grant for 3 additional Full-Time officers.

Micro Grants for equipment (200K) Every vehicle has a printer, in the process of getting scanners for more cars.
