Public Meetings

Board of Supervisors

The Board of Supervisors will hold their regular meetings in the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Mondays of the month. The Dover Township Board of Supervisors invites the public to attend.

Industrial & Commercial Development Committee

The Dover Township Industrial and Commercial Development Committee promotes industrial and commercial activities that will expand the greater Dover area tax base. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 4:00 PM on the fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month.

Planning Commission

The Dover Township Planning Commission is a five member Commission with one alternate member. The term of office is a five year staggered term. This Commission is an advisory body to the Board of Supervisors. The Authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The local ordinance of control is the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance of Dover Township and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan.

Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the first (1st) Wednesday of the month.

Sewer Authority

The Dover Township Sewer Authority is the owner and financier of the Wastewater Treatment Facility, a regional facility, for Dover Township. The body is a five member, staggered term, Authority authorized by the Authorities Act of 1945 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is a Non-Operating Authority due to a "Lease Back Agreement" of operation to the Township. Meetings are held at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 851 Graffius Road, York, Pennsylvania, at 6:00 PM on the fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month.

Zoning Hearing Board

The Dover Township Zoning Hearing Board is a five member Board. This body is a Quasi Judicial Body whose authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There is one alternate member. The term is a five year staggered term. Local authority guidance for operational decisions is established by the Dover Township Zoning Ordinance and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the third (3rd) Wednesday of the month **AS NEEDED**. Please check www.dovertownship.org for details and updates on scheduled meetings.

THE BACKGROUND EQUIPMENT WAS PURCHASED WITH DEP 902 RECYCLING GRANT FUNDING. THIS UNIT WILL NOT ONLY HELP WITH THE SAFETY OF OUR PUBLIC WORKS CREWS BUT IT WILL ALSO DECREASE THE NEEDED MANPOWER FOR LEAF COLLECTION MOVING FORWARD. PUBLIC WORKS CREWS WILL BEGIN COLLECTING LEAVES STARTING OCTOBER 28TH THROUGH THE WEEK OF DECEMBER 2ND, 2024. HAVE ALL LEAVES TO THE CURB BY DECEMBER 2ND. PROVIDE DIRECT ACCESS TO THE LEAVES BY PARKING VEHICLES AWAY FROM THE PILES. LEAVES SHOULD BE PLACED ALONG THE CURB OR EDGE OF THE ROADWAY. DO NOT PLACE LEAF PILES BEHIND OR AROUND OBSTACLES SUCH AS TREES, MAILBOXES, POLES, ETC. LEAVES THAT ARE INACCESSIBLE WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. DO NOT PUT BRANCHES, GRASS CLIPPINGS, BRUSH, OR ANY DEBRIS UNDER OR IN THE LEAF PILE. THIS WILL CAUSE MAJOR DAMAGE TO THE EQUIPMENT AND DELAY THE COLLECTION. THERE IS NO SET SCHEDULE FOR THE LEAF COLLECTION CREWS SO PLEASE BE PATIENT AND REFRAIN FROM CALLING INTO THE TOWNSHIP. WE WILL DO OUR BEST TO PICK YOUR LEAVES UP IN A TIMELY MANNER. STAY UP TO DATE AND GET ALERTS ABOUT LEAF COLLECTION WITH THE SAVVY CITIZEN APP!

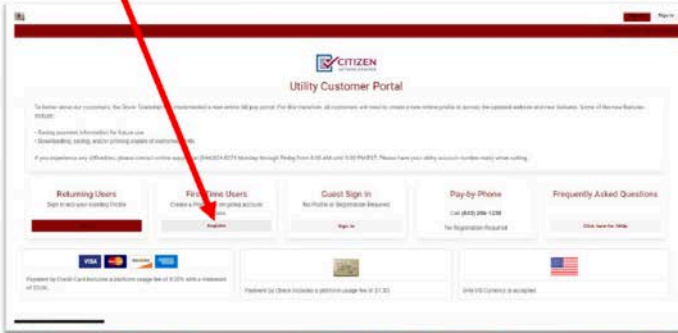

What does this do?



The MXU box Reads the water meter from the street for billing purposes. Please do not cover up or block the MXU box with trash cans or vegetation. Crews need to have access to the MXU box for manual reads or repairs. Please call Dover Township if the MXU box becomes damaged or dislodged from the side of the house.

What NOT to FLUSH!

As of May 30, 2024, the Township has 2,695.966 acres of preserved farmland. A zoning chart was sent out in the Summer Newsletter highlighting Dover's agricultural & rural character. Pennsylvania's recent 10-year Strategic Plan for Economic Development has identified the agricultural community as a priority industry sector for investment. We have begun the planning process to highlight our agriculture community in Dover, and we will publish more information in 2025. Explore York has provided artwork to be used for signage at preserved farm locations. This effort was identified as a goal & objective in the 2020-2030 Implementable Comprehensive Plan.

Goals and Objectives

1. Enhance the Agricultural Heritage

- a. Continue to preserve farmland through preservation programs and effective agricultural zoning.
- b. Maintain the growth boundaries' integrity by not expanding them unless necessary for health and safety concerns.
- c. Develop methods for the farming community to expand business opportunities within the Region.
- d. Increase access to foods and add more fresh food stands.
- e. Have one of the local non-profits work with Dover Area School District to provide healthy local foods to supplement their weekend backpack program.
- f. Work to identify and provide interpretive signs of permanently preserved farms within Dover.

Northern York County Regional Police



Project Lifesaver



Project Lifesaver provides law enforcement with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. The program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved ones home."

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized frequency to locate the position of the individual.

The Northern York County Regional Police Department has nine officers trained in the operation of the Project Lifesaver Program. Four of these officers are School Resource Officers.

material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation not listed below.



Do NOT place these items out for yard waste collection:



How to Prepare Yard Waste:

- Place your yard waste in biodegradable brown paper bags or bundle it with biodegradable twine in easy-to-handle bundles.
 - Bundles may be no longer than 5 feet in length.
 - Bundles may not weigh more than 30 pounds each.
 - Branches may not exceed 6 inches in diameter.
- Yard waste must then be placed at the curb on your scheduled yard waste pick up day before your collection time.
- An Unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb.

Yard Waste in Plastic Bags WILL NOT be collected!

dispose of one (1) bulk item per week by scheduling collection through our customer service department. Please follow the guidelines listed.



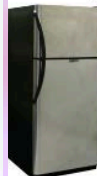
Acceptable

- Appliances (i.e. washer, dryer, microwave)
- Carpet (48 inch maximum length, must be rolled and tied)
- Car tires only - No Rims! (2 tires = 1 bulk item)
- Furniture
- Lawn mowers (oil and gasoline must be removed)
- Mattress & box spring
- Plumbing fixtures (i.e. toilets & sinks)

- No items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will be collected.
- Additional trash bags ARE NOT considered bulk items!
- Call Penn Waste at 717-767-4456 to schedule collection of all bulk items.
- Please have your bulk item curbside the evening before your scheduled collection day.

Unacceptable:

- Automobile parts
- Car & Truck batteries
- Chemicals, stains & liquids
- Commercial/industrial waste
- Construction material (i.e. drywall, masonry, lumber, roofing shingles, tiles)
- Freon Appliances
- Hazardous waste
- Tires on rims
- Electronic Waste

Rechargeable Batteries Do Not Go into Your Trash or Recycling

If you have a cellphone, you use a rechargeable battery. If you use power tools, you use rechargeable batteries. While convenient during their lifetime, rechargeable batteries require proper disposal when they are no longer usable. Conventional disposal of these types of batteries in your curbside pickup can cause problems! Trash is compacted both in the garbage truck and at our facility. When subjected to intense pressure these batteries combust and ignite causing fires in either garbage trucks or at our facility. Rechargeable batteries should not go into your recycling bin either. Please dispose of them properly! Keep rechargeable batteries out of your curbside trash and recycling bin and dispose of them properly. 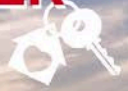

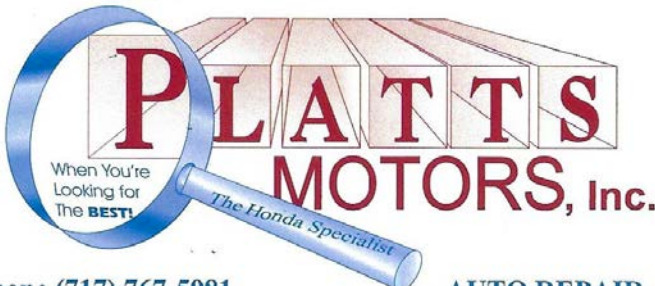

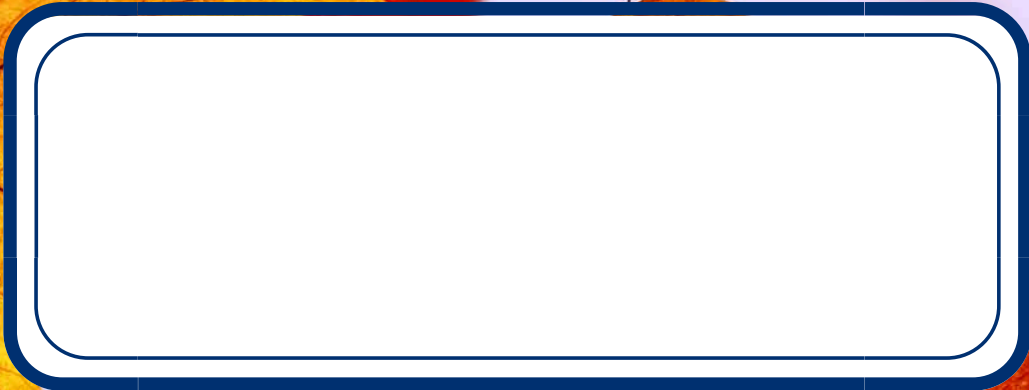
