BRANDON HALL MEMORIAL TREE

In remembrance of Brandon McLean Hall (June 13, 1983 – November 15, 2021), a beloved son, brother, uncle, grandson, nephew, and cousin, an *October Red Maple* tree was planted at the Miller Family Park by the Hall Family.

Brandon was born in Baltimore and grew up in New Freedom. Following graduation from high school he attended York College of Pennsylvania, where in 2006 he graduated with a bachelor's degree in chemistry. Brandon was employed for 10 years by McCormick and Company. He loved camping, hiking, and the outdoors. He participated in scouting and at the age of 16 years earned the Eagle Scout award. He loved music, art, and working on puzzles. Brandon had an incredible love for his dog, Penny, who he loved dearly.

2025 BUDGET & TAXES

The 2025 budget was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on December 4, 2024, without a real estate tax increase.

In addition to the general purpose real estate tax, the fire protection and emergency services tax remain unchanged. There was a slight increase to the water hydrant special assessment, from 0.095 to 0.115 mill, for an increase of \$5.00 for a home assessed at \$250,000.

There are several park improvement projects planned for the new year.

The total budget (combined revenue & expenditures) for 2025 is \$7.92 million dollars.

TOWNSHIP AWARDED \$783,155 IN GRANTS FOR PARK PROJECTS

In 2024, the Township was awarded four (4) grants totaling \$783,155 for various park improvement projects. The grants received are as follows:

\$273,725 - Hametown Park Playground Rehabilitation – Community Conservation Partnership Program grant through the PA Dept. Conservation & Natural Resources. The project removes the sand volleyball court (rarely used) and replacing it with and expanded tot & youth playground, along with a courtyard with benches and landscaping, as well as grills for the existing pavilion.

\$220,000 - Windy Hill Park Pavilion – PA Dept. of Community & Economic Development grant through the Statewide Local Share Program (Gaming Funds). The project will provide for the construction of a new 33' x 44' pavilion (the first in the park).

\$150,000 - Miller Family Park Land Purchase – York County Open Space & Land Preservation Grant program. The grant will assist with the purchase of an additional 13½ acres of land adjacent to the Miller Family Park, which will increase the park size to 35+ acres.



\$130,550 - Miller Family Park Land Purchase - Community Conservation Partnership Program through the PA Dept. Conservation & Natural Resources. This is the second grant received to be used toward the purchase of an additional 13½ acres of land adjacent to the Miller Family Park.

\$8,880 – Miller Family Park Master Plan – York County Open Space & Land Preservation Grant Program. This grant will be used to revise/update the park's master plan after the additional 13½ acres of adjacent land is acquired by the Township.

UNDERSTANDING YOUR PROPERTY TAX BILLS

The Township Office and the Tax Collector frequently receive questions about tax bills. What is this tax bill for, who receives the taxes, why do I receive two (2) tax bills each year, etc. Hopefully, the following brief explanation of each tax bill will help answer those questions.

FEBRUARY (Municipal) Tax Bill (Calendar Year)

The tax bill that is mailed in February of each year includes both the York County and the Shrewsbury Township taxes/assessments on one (1) bill. The breakdown is as follows, **based upon** a property **assessed value** of **\$250,000**:

- ¹ **York County (Real Estate Tax)** – revenue from this tax is used for the general operation of the County. The tax rate is set by the York County Commissioners.
- ² **Township (Real Estate Tax)** – revenue generated from this real estate tax is used for general operations of the Township [*i.e. roads, stormwater, recreation, parks, personnel, administration, legal, engineering, insurances, equipment, building & equipment maintenance, utilities, planning & zoning, debt service, and community organization donations (libraries, senior center, rail trail, etc.)*]. Current tax rate has not changed since 2008, which is set by the Shrewsbury Township Board of Supervisors.
- ³ **EMS Tax** – this is a new tax beginning in 2024, which was implemented to provide additional support to the two (2) ambulance services that serve the Township; specifically, Rose (New Freedom) EMS and Glen Rock Ambulance. The decline in volunteers and reduction in Medicare/Medicaid reimbursement, has resulted in the need to rely on more paid staff. This tax can be used **ONLY** for EMS; it cannot be used for any other purpose. The tax rate is set by the Shrewsbury Township Board of Supervisors.
- ⁴ **Fire Tax** – this tax has been in place since 2008. It provides financial support to the three (3) “*all volunteer*” fire companies that serve Shrewsbury Township, which includes Glen Rock Hose & Ladder, Rose (New Freedom) Fire Company, and Shrewsbury Volunteer Fire Company. The revenue collected by this tax can be used **ONLY** to support the volunteer fire companies. The tax rate is set by the Shrewsbury Township Board of Supervisors.
- ⁵ **Hydrant Assessment** – this is a special assessment on any property that is located within 780 feet (maximum distance set by state law) of a fire hydrant owned by The York Water Company or Glen Rock Water Authority. The Township is billed annually for the rental of each fire hydrant. Shrewsbury Borough does not bill for their fire hydrants. The revenue collected from this special assessment is also restricted to expenses related to the fire hydrant rental charges. The assessment rate is set by the Shrewsbury Township Board of Supervisors.

JULY (School) Tax Bill ⁶ (Fiscal Year July 1 – June 30)

This tax bill is mailed in July of each year and is for the Southern York County School District (Susquehannock). The tax rate is set by the Southern York County School Board.



The breakdown of total taxes is as follows, **based upon** a property **assessed value** of **\$250,000**:

TAX COLLECTOR

The tax collector is elected to a four (4) year term, who is responsible for collecting the taxes from Shrewsbury Township property owners on behalf of the Township, York County, and the Southern York County School District, each of whom set their own tax rates.

FIREWORKS...Know the Law

With summer upon us, so comes the peak fireworks season. The following is a general list (not all inclusive) of the state law related to the use of consumer-grade fireworks:

- Cannot be discharged within 150 feet of any building or vehicle, whether or not the building is owned by the fireworks consumer.
- Cannot be discharged on public or private property without owner permission.
- Cannot be discharged within a building or vehicle, regardless if the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the consumer fireworks.
- Cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance. Additional details about the PA Fireworks law can be found on the Pennsylvania State Police website: www.psp.pa.gov.

2024 FIRE PROTECTION & EMS TAX DISTRIBUTIONS

FIRE Tax distributions in 2024 were as follows (after workers' compensation and tax collection deductions):

- \$ 67,160 – Glen Rock Hose & Ladder
- \$ 80,985 – Rose (New Freedom) Fire Company
- \$115,972 – Shrewsbury Fire Company

The formula used to determine the allocations is based upon a flat contribution of \$35,000 plus a percentage based on the number of calls for each department and the assessed value of real estate within each departments service area.

EMS Tax distributions in 2024 were as follows (after workers' compensation and tax collection deductions):

- \$ 40,000 – Glen Rock EMS
- \$148,919 – Rose EMS (New Freedom)

The formula used to determine the allocation for Rose EMS (New Freedom) is based on the percentage of calls between New Freedom Borough, Shrewsbury Borough and Shrewsbury Township (which makes up 95% of the total call volume).

The allocation for Glen Rock EMS continues to be a flat contribution, but would change to the same formula used for Rose if the Townships of Codorus & Springfield, and Glen Rock Borough, implement the same formula with their annual contributions.

MUNICIPAL PRIMARY ELECTION

The Pennsylvania Municipal Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, May 20, 2025. Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM. Shrewsbury Township positions on the 2025 primary ballot are as follows:

- ⇒ Supervisor (6 year term) – One (1) position
- ⇒ Tax Collector (4 year term) – One (1) position
- ⇒ Auditor (4 year term) – One (1) position
- ⇒ Auditor (6 year term) – One (1) position

BACKYARD CHICKENS

A frequent question asked is whether chickens can be kept on a residential property. The zoning ordinance regulations for chickens are as follows:

The keeping of chickens as emotional support animals is prohibited and are not protected under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

• **3 acres or Less** (allowed only in the **Agricultural Zoning District**)

~ Maximum of 10 chickens. Hens only; no roosters.

• **3 - 10 acres**

~ One (1) acre devoted exclusively and continually available to livestock are required for each animal equivalent unit (1,000 pounds of live weight).

• **10 acres or more**

~ No limitations.

PRESERVED FARMS GROW IN TOWNSHIP

In 2024 there were two (2) additional Shrewsbury Township farms preserved through the York County Agricultural Land Preservation Board, adding 136 acres for a new total of 3,366 acres of preserved farmland in Shrewsbury Township.

When land is preserved under the program, a deed of agricultural conservation easement has been executed, and the restrictions placed on the land limits the use to commercial agricultural preservation in perpetuity (forever).

PA PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE PROGRAM

TAX REFUND

Older adults and people with disabilities 18 and older in Pennsylvania may be eligible to receive up to \$1,000 in rebates. The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program supports homeowners and renters across Pennsylvania by providing a rebate ranging from \$380 to \$1,000 to eligible older adults and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The program is supported by funds from the Pennsylvania Lottery and Gaming.

Homeowners and renters in Pennsylvania may be eligible to receive up to \$1,000 through a standard rebate. The amount of money you will receive is based on your income. Some applicants may qualify for supplemental rebates as well.

Income	Maximum Rebate
\$0 - \$8,270	\$1,000
\$8,271 - \$15,510	\$770
\$15,511 - \$18,610	\$460
\$18,611 - \$46,520	\$380

This program supports Pennsylvania homeowners and renters who are 65 and older, widows or widowers 50 and older, or people with disabilities 18 and older. In addition to age requirements, your household income must be \$46,520 or less annually.

Applications are due by June 30, 2025.

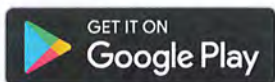
