July 1, 2025

The work session was called to order by Chairman Weimer at 6:00pm at the Coolbaugh Township Municipal Center located at 5520 Municipal Drive, Tobyhanna, PA.

1. Discussion on Proposed Convenience Store at 1545 Prospect Street (Attorney Erich Schock)

Attorney Schock and Engineer John Cogan were in attendance representing the developer. Attorney Schock stated that the developers, engineers and applicant have been working on the proposed Wawa convenience store regarding the traffic flow and PennDot review. They anticipate submitting a sketch plan for review by the Township Engineer and the Planning Commission. They stated that it has taken more time than they anticipated addressing PennDot's comments while also preserving the desired layout. PennDot is requiring more than one entrance for gas station use and stated that it is anticipated that they will receive permitting for a full access driveway on Route 611 with the Prospect Street access movement still to be finalized.

• **Discussion:** Ms. Ruiz-Smith asked about the resident that believes that your survey markers are encroaching on his property, being advised by Engineer Cogan that the previous surveys and the survey that was just completed show that it is our property and the only place that the line is not exact is the county GIS map and the county will also tell you that a survey should be completed in order to have accurate property lines determined. Solicitor Armstrong asked is they will still be asking for zoning relief, being advised that they do not believe they will need it for the development of the property but may need it for the required signage. Ms. Kelly stated that there are approximately 25 houses on Prospect Street and stated for the ease of traffic flow and minimal impact on the residents, she would like to see a right in/ right out of the Prospect Street access as opposed to full movement. Ms. Kelly asked if the signs are dimmable at night, being advised that they are. She also asked about the fencing to ensure that there will not be any impact to the neighboring resident's properties, being advised they will install fencing and

landscaping. Mr. Weimer thanked Attorney Schock and Mr. Cogan for listening to the Board's concerns. Ms. Ruiz-Smith stated that the employees at the Tobyhanna Army Depot are very excited for the addition to the town. D. Pope stated that it is a good addition.

ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS

1. Describe the chosen disposal method, its location, the daily flow proposed and if the method is an interim method (to be replaced by the ultimate method in 5 years or less), or is an ultimate method (to serve the development in the long term, for 5 years or more). The proposed development is to be serviced utilizing the existing municipal collection system. The anticipated daily flow from the development is 2,500 GPD (or 12 EDUs, based on the Pocono Mountains Industrial Park Authority's rate of 200 gallons/EDU). The anticipated flow amount is based on an estimate of 15 office employees (10 GPD/employee) and 60 warehouse employees (35 GPD/employee). Pocono Mountains Industrial Park Authority can provide the capacity within their collection, conveyance, and treatment systems and have confirmed allocation.

2. Describe the types of land uses adjacent to the project area (Agricultural, Residential, Commercial, etc.) and the type of sewage disposal method serving each of those land uses.

The properties immediately adjacent to the development are located within the Commercial and Residential Zoning Districts per the Coolbaugh Township Zoning Ordinance. The properties to the east and north are presently developed with commercial and residential uses and served by on-lot septic systems. The properties to the west and south are presently developed with commercial/industrial uses and are connected to the municipal sanitary sewer system.

3. Indicate if the adjacent sewage facilities described in (2) are in need of improvement due to high rates of on lot malfunction or overloaded public sewers. If any of the sewage facilities described above are in need of improvement due to high on lot malfunction rates, a sewage disposal project alternative that proposes to upgrade or construct facilities to serve these needs areas, as well as the proposed project area, may be more viable than a method intended only to serve the current project.

At the time of this narrative, it is our understanding that Pocono Mountains Industrial Park Authority Treatment Plant has adequate capacity to be able to serve the 5-year projected flows. There are no known existing sewage management program(s) in the area, or any sewage management program(s) that this project would be required to participate in. 3

4. Describe several other sewage collection technologies and collection system routes that could be used to serve this project. Consider all reasonable possibilities and compare them with the selected alternative's technology.

The project is located within a public sewer service area per the Coolbaugh Township's Official Sewage Facilities Plan.

5. Describe why the proposed method was chosen over any of the other methods described in the alternative analysis. Environmental, administrative, and financial concerns may be addressed. Also indicate how the chosen method will guarantee adequate sewage disposal for the development in both the short-term (up to 5 years) and long-term (beyond 5 years) by describing the adequacy of the proposed facilities (organic and hydraulic loading) and the ability of the facility to accept additional flows or loads.

Since there is no feasible area located within the project boundary capable of supporting an on-lot septic system, therefore the project is proposed to connect to the existing municipal sewerage system. Since it is connected to an existing permitted municipal facility, the required capacity for the site will be guaranteed.

6. Indicate who will be the owner of the facility, and who will be responsible for operation and maintenance of the facility. To assure adequate long-term sewage disposal for the project, the disposal system must be properly operated and maintained. The applicant must indicate in the analysis who will be the owner of the facility and who will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the facility. This may be a municipality, a sewer authority or a management agency; however, the ultimate responsibility lies with the municipality.

The pump station located on-site shall be owned and maintained by the property owner. A maintenance agreement shall be executed between the property owner and PMIPA.

The enclosed plans and documents have been revised in response to the review comments provided in the DEP Review Letter dated January 16, 2025.

An item-by-item response to the comments has been provided below:

- 1. Please edit the project narrative to correct or address the following:
 - a. The project narrative states the sewerage usage for the project is 12 EDUs "per Mount Pocono Municipal Authority"; however, Item #1 of the Alternative Analysis states the EDUs are based on Pocono Mountains Industrial Park Authority's rate.

The reference to "Mount Pocono Municipal Authority" has been corrected to be consistent.

b. The amount of proposed sewage flows for office workers and warehouse staff appears to be based on flow amounts described under 25 Pa Code 73.17(b) for on-lot sewage disposal, rather than the Domestic Wastewater Facilities Manual, or a schedule from the Authority.

While the GPD/employee rates that were used to determine the required flow allocation has been based on the values provided in PA Code 73.17, they have been used to determine an acceptable amount of allocation that was negotiated between the applicant and Pocono Mountains Industrial Park Authority.

This permit is issued in response to an application filed with the Department of Environmental Protection on the 8th day of August A.D. 2021 and with the understanding that the work shall be performed in accordance with the maps, plans, profiles and specifications filed with and made a part of the application on September 9th, 2021, December 2nd, 2021 and February 8th, 2022, subject, however, to the provisions of the Dam Safety and Encroachments Act, the Flood Plain Management Act, the Clean Streams Law, the Administrative Code, the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder and the following conditions and restrictions:

- 1. The permittee shall sign the Acknowledgement of Appraisal of Permit Conditions thereby expressly certifying the permittee's acceptance of, and agreement to comply with, the terms and conditions of this permit. The permittee shall return a signed copy of the Acknowledgement of Appraisal of Permit Conditions to the Department. Unless the Acknowledgement of Appraisal of Permit Conditions for is completed and filed with the Department, this permit is void.
- 2. The Department, in issuing this permit, has relied on the information and data which the permittee has provided in connection with his permit application. If, subsequent to the issuance of this permit, such information and data prove to be false, incomplete or inaccurate, this permit may be modified, suspended, or revoked, in whole or in part, and the Department may, in addition, institute appropriate legal proceedings.
- 3. This permit does not give any property rights, either in real estate or material, nor any exclusive privileges, nor shall it be construed to grant or confer any right, title, easement, or interest in, to, or over any land belonging to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; neither does it authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights, nor any infringement of Federal, State, or Local laws or regulations; nor does it obviate the necessity of obtaining Federal assent when necessary.
- 4. The work shall at all times be subject to supervision and inspection by representatives of the Department, and no changes in the maps, plans, profiles, and specifications as approved shall be made except with the written consent of the Department. The Department, however, reserves the right to require such changes or modifications in the maps, plans, profiles, and specifications as may be considered necessary. The Department further reserves the right to suspend or revoke this permit if in its opinion the best interest of the Commonwealth will be subserved thereby.
- 5. This permit authorizes the construction, operation, maintenance and normal repair of the permitted structures conducted within the original specifications for the water obstruction

or encroachment, and in accordance with the regulations of the Department and terms and conditions of this permit. Any repairs or maintenance involving modifications of the water obstruction or encroachment from its original specifications, and any repairs or reconstruction involving a substantial portion of the structure as defined by regulations of the Department shall require the prior written approval and permit of the Department.

- 6. All construction debris, excavated material, brush, rocks, and refuse incidental to this work shall be removed entirely from the stream channel and placed either on shore above the influence of flood waters, or at such dumping ground as may be approved by the Department.
- 7. There shall be no unreasonable interference with the free discharge of the river or stream or navigation during construction.
- 8. If future operations by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania require modification of the structure or work, or if, in the opinion of the Department of Environmental Protection, the structure or work shall cause unreasonable obstruction to the free passage of floodwaters or navigation, the permittee shall, upon due notice remove or alter the structures, work or obstructions caused thereby, without expense to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, so as to increase the flood carrying capacity of the channel or render navigation reasonably free, easy, and unobstructed, in such manner as the Department may require. No claim shall be made against the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on account of any such removal or alteration.
- 9. The permittee shall notify the Department, in writing, of the proposed time for commencement of work at least 15 days prior to the commencement of construction.
- 10. - 18. The project site shall at all times be available for inspection by authorized officers and employees of the County Conservation District. Prior to commencement and upon completion of the work authorized by this permit, the permittee shall notify the Monroe County Conservation District at: 8050 Running Valley Road, Stroudsburg, PA 18360.
- 19. Work may not commence until a signed copy of the Acknowledgement of Appraisal of Permit Conditions is received by the Department. INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

and between Coolbaugh Township, a Pennsylvania Second Class Township, with offices located at 5520 Municipal Drive, Tobyhanna, Monroe County, Pennsylvania (hereinafter referred to as "TOWNSHIP") and Nicholas Valentine, owner of the property located at 89 Westwood Blvd.,

Gouldsboro, Coolbaugh Township, Pennsylvania. (hereinafter referred to as "OWNER"),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of the premises located at 89 Westwood Blvd., Gouldsboro, Coolbaugh Township, Monroe County, Pennsylvania, more particularly described as Monroe County Parcel ID No. 03.16.2.2 and Monroe County Map No. 03633902572504 ("PREMISES"); and

WHEREAS, the Premises currently has an on-lot sewage system which is outdated and needs to be replaced; and

WHEREAS, Owner wishes to install a new septic system on the Premises; and

WHEREAS, Owner and the Sewage Enforcement Officer of the Township have determined that, due to the existing features of the Premises, no new on-lot sewage system can

be installed on the above-referenced Premises in strict conformity with the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, Title 25, Pennsylvania Code ("CODE"), Chapter 73, Section 73.13, relating to the required minimum horizontal isolation distance of one hundred feet (100') between an existing well and the absorption area of a proposed sewage disposal system; and

WHEREAS, Owner cannot install an on-lot sewage system on the Premises in compliance with the abovesaid Chapter 73 of the Code because the private well located on the Premises will be closer than one hundred feet (100') to the absorption area of the proposed on-lot sewage disposal system; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 73, Section 73.3(b) of the Code, entitled "Policy" provides that, when considering corrective measures for malfunctioning sewage disposal systems which have been constructed in accordance with Chapter 73 or applicable regulations at the time of construction, the efforts of the Sewage Enforcement Officer shall not be restricted by Chapter 73 and further provides that it is the policy of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) and sewage enforcement officers administering Chapter 73 to consider all individual and community sewage systems described in Chapter 73 in the correction of existing or malfunctioning systems and when the systems are not physically possible, to provide the best technical guidance possible in attempting to resolve existing pollution or environmental health problems; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 72, Section 72.33(a) of the Code provides that if a sewage disposal system is proposed to replace a malfunctioning septic system and will be located less than one hundred feet (100') from any wells on the subject lot and/or neighboring lots, the local agency (Township) may grant a well isolation distance exemption to the applicant; and

WHEREAS, Owner has submitted a formal written request for a well isolation distance exemption to the Township pursuant to Chapter 72, Section 72.33(c) of the Code because the existing private well on the Premises will be located closer than one hundred feet (100') to the absorption area of the proposed on-lot sewage system, and in particular the existing well will be located approximately 45.2 feet from the absorption area of the proposed on-lot sewage system as described in the May 7, 2025 correspondence from the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer; and

WHEREAS, all other wells located on neighboring properties will be located more than one hundred feet (100') from the absorption area of the proposed on-lot sewage system; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 72, Section 72.33(e) of the Code states that the local agency, municipality, sewage enforcement officer, and PA DEP will incur no liability as a result of the local agency granting an exemption under this Section; and

WHEREAS, the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer ("SEO") has advised the Township that a permit may be issued to Owner in order to construct the new system pursuant to Chapter 73 of the Code and has further advised the Township that the new system will comply as closely as possible with applicable sections of Chapter 73 of the Code and therefore the issuance of permits to construct a new system will comply with Chapter 73 of the Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, for and in consideration of mutual promises and conditions, fully acknowledging said consideration is good and valuable, and intending to be legally bound, hereby do agree as follows:

1. All introductory clauses set forth above are incorporated herein by reference as though the same were more fully set forth herein at length.

2. The Township SEO shall be permitted to issue the appropriate permits to Owner which will enable Owner to construct the replacement on-lot sewage disposal system on the Premises as described in the May 7, 2025 correspondence from the Township's Sewage Enforcement Officer. A true and correct copy of the permit is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

3. As consideration for the issuance of such permit, Owner and Owner's heirs, successors and assigns shall be solely responsible for any and all damages, injury or loss caused by the construction of the proposed on-lot sewage system described in the above-referenced May 7, 2025 correspondence from the Sewage Enforcement Officer, and shall, at Owner's own expense, repair any damages done to abutting and/or adjacent property owners or his, her, or their land, or the existing well(s) on the Premises and/or neighboring properties because of the construction of the said sewage system.

4. Owner, intending to be legally bound hereby, for himself, and his heirs, successors and assigns, does hereby indemnify, remise, release, waive and forever discharge the Township, its agents and employees, from all, and all manner of, actions, causes of actions, suits, debts, accounts, bonds, covenants, contracts, agreements, judgments, claims and demands of whatsoever kind in law or in equity, known or unknown, foreseen or unforeseen, which Owner now has or may hereafter have against the Township related to the issuance of a permit for the installation and operation of a non-compliant sewage system for the Premises located at 89 Westwood Blvd., Gouldsboro, PA, Tax Parcel No. 03.16.2.2, as set forth in this Agreement and the above-referenced May 7, 2025 correspondence from the Sewage Enforcement Officer. Owner further agrees to and shall indemnify, defend, release and forever discharge the Township and hold the Township harmless from any and all claims and/or causes of action of Owner, or Owner's heirs, successors or assigns, or other third parties and/or neighboring property owners

for damages and/or injuries resulting from the Township waiving the well isolation distance requirement as provided for in the Code and/or allowing for the installation of the non-compliant sewage system for the Premises.

5. Further, Owner, intending to be legally bound hereby, for himself, his heirs, successors and assigns does hereby agree to hold the Township harmless and to defend and indemnify the Township and its officers, consultants and employees from and against any and all claims, actions, demands and suits of any nature or kind and to pay any and all expenses incurred by the Township, including reasonable attorneys' fees and engineering fees incidental to the defense of any such claims or actions which could have or may arise in any manner due to the approval of the aforesaid non-compliant sewage system and/or the waiver of the well isolation distance requirement or out of damages or injuries including death to persons or property caused by or sustained in connection with the construction and use of the said on-lot septic system, any improvements erected thereto in accordance with the terms of the permit issued, and any and all claims or actions of any kind or any damages arising out of any surface water conditions, or septic discharge or overrun, connected with the construction or operation of the non-compliant septic system under the terms of the permit issued or the performance of any construction called for under the terms of the aforesaid permit.

6. Owner specifically agrees to and shall comply with all requirements and ordinances of the Township, including but not limited to the Coolbaugh Township Zoning Ordinance, when using the Premises, and shall not use the Premises in a manner inconsistent with the Township's Ordinances and/or the applicable permits issued by the Sewage Enforcement Officer and/or other Township official.

7. This Indemnification Agreement is a covenant running with the land and shall be filed with the Monroe County Recorder of Deeds Office.

8. The parties agree that any disputes regarding the interpretation of this Agreement or the responsibilities associated therewith shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Monroe County Court of Common Pleas.

RESOLUTION NO. 09-2025

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF COOLBAUGH TOWNSHIP, MONROE COUNTY, IMPLEMENTING ACT 57 OF 2022.

WHEREAS, Act 57 of 2022 ("Act 57") amended the Local Tax Collection Law and was signed by then Governor Wolf on July 11, 2022, and took effect on October 10, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Act 57 requires taxing districts that impose taxes on the assessed value of real property to adopt a resolution or ordinance directing the tax collector to waive additional charges for real estate taxes in certain situations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Tax Collector of Coolbaugh Township shall comply with the provisions of Act 57 and this resolution for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2025.

SECTION I. Definitions. The following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them within this resolution unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

ADDITIONAL CHARGE

Any interest, fee, penalty, or charge accruing to and in excess of the face amount of the real estate tax as provided in the real estate tax notice.

QUALIFYING EVENT

1. For the purposes of real property, the date of transfer of ownership.

2. For manufactured or mobile homes, the date of transfer of ownership or the date a lease agreement commences for the original location or relocation of a manufactured or mobile home on a parcel of land not owned by the owner of the manufactured or mobile home. The term does not include the renewal of a lease for the same location.

TAX COLLECTOR

The elected tax collector for Coolbaugh Township, Monroe County, any authorized or designated delinquent tax collector, the Monroe County Tax Claim Bureau, or any alternative collector of taxes as provided for in the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L.1368, No.542), known as the "Real Estate Tax Sale Law," an employee, agent or assignee authorized to collect the tax, a purchaser of claim for the tax or any other person authorized by law or contract to secure collection of, or take any action at law or in equity against the person or property of the taxpayer for the real estate tax or amounts, liens or claims derived from the real estate tax.

SECTION II. Waiver. The Tax Collector shall, for tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2025, grant a request to waive Additional Charges for real estate taxes if the taxpayer does all of the following:

- A. Provides a waiver request of Additional Charges, on a form provided by the State Department of Community and Economic Development, to the Tax Collector in possession of the claim within twelve (12) months of a Qualifying Event;
- B. Attests that a tax notice was not received;
- C. Provides the Tax Collector in possession of the claim with one of the following:
 - 1. A copy of the deed showing the date of real property transfer; or
 - 2. A copy of the title following the acquisition of a mobile or manufactured home subject to taxation as real estate showing the date of issuance or a copy of an executed lease agreement between the owner of a mobile or manufactured home and the owner of a parcel of land on which the mobile or manufactured home will be situated showing the date the lease commences; and
- D. Pays the face value amount of the tax notice for the real estate tax with the waiver request.
