

## A Message from Chief Aldo Legge and the Center Township Police Department

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.

The men and women of the Center Township Police Department are proud to serve Potter Township. Through vigilance, professionalism, and community partnership, we remain committed to upholding the law and protecting the families we are honored to serve. Respectfully,

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.







## A Message from Chief Aldo Legge and the Center Township Police Department

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.





Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.







As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.







Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.







## A Message from Chief Aldo Legge and the Center Township Police Department

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.

## A Message from Chief Aldo Legge and the Center Township Police Department

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.

## A Message from Chief Aldo Legge and the Center Township Police Department

As we welcome the warmer days of spring and look ahead to early summer, the Center Township Police Department encourages all residents of Potter Township to remain attentive while enjoying the season. Warmer weather naturally brings increased outdoor activity — children playing in neighborhoods, families visiting parks and playgrounds, bicyclists traveling our roadways, and pedestrians taking advantage of longer daylight hours. We respectfully remind motorists to reduce speed, remain alert, and exercise heightened caution, particularly in residential areas and school zones. A few extra seconds of awareness can make a lasting difference in protecting our community.

Our commitment to public safety remains unwavering. In January 2026, our officers responded to 931 calls for service, representing a 44.79% increase compared to January 2025. Of those calls, 30 occurred within Potter Township, reflecting our continued dedication to serving your community with professionalism and integrity. Even with the rise in service calls, substantial investigations declined by 32.26%, demonstrating enhanced patrol effectiveness, proactive enforcement strategies, and strengthened investigative practices. Through these efforts, the department achieved the highest case clearance rate in its history — reinforcing accountability, delivering justice, and strengthening community trust.

Traffic safety continues to be a primary focus. During January, officers conducted 263 traffic enforcement actions — a 90.58% increase from the previous year — including citations, warnings, and targeted enforcement initiatives. These efforts contributed to a 23.26% reduction in reportable major traffic crashes compared to January 2025. As seasonal activity increases, our officers will maintain proactive patrols to deter dangerous driving behaviors and safeguard motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike.

The department also continues to invest in advanced technology, enhanced reporting systems, lifesaving equipment such as in-vehicle defibrillators, and ongoing professional training to ensure our officers are prepared to meet evolving public safety challenges.

The men and women of the Center Township Police Department are proud to serve Potter Township. Through vigilance, professionalism, and community partnership, we remain committed to upholding the law and protecting the families we are honored to serve. Respectfully,
