

Q1 Do you use the Chartiers Creek Trail

Question 3 - Which Activities do you use the trail [Creekside Trail] for most?

Most Popular Activities:

- Walking By far the most mentioned activity, appearing in over half of all responses
- Dog walking The second most common activity, often combined with walking
- Running/Jogging Frequently mentioned, sometimes paired with other activities

Other Common Activities:

- Biking Popular but less frequent than walking activities
- **Bird watching** A notable nature-focused activity
- Fishing Mentioned regularly throughout responses
- Nature observation/study Including plant identification and general nature appreciation


Less Common but Notable Activities:

- Photography
- Playing with children near the creek
- Rock skipping/throwing
- Cross-country skiing
- Swimming (though safety concerns were noted)
- Commuting
- Reading outdoors
- YouTube filming

Key Insights: The trail serves primarily as a pedestrian corridor, with walking and dog walking dominating usage. Many respondents combine multiple activities during their visits. There's strong interest in nature-based activities beyond just exercise, suggesting the trail's value as both a recreational and educational resource. Some respondents noted infrastructure limitations (like bike trail quality) that might affect their activity choices.

Q4 Do you use the Baker's Acres property?



Question 6 - Which activities do you use the trail [Bakers Acres] for most?

Most Popular Activities:

- Walking Overwhelmingly the most common activity, mentioned in the vast majority of responses
- Dog walking The second most frequent activity, often the primary purpose for trail
 use
- Biking Third most common, including both regular and gravel biking

Other Notable Activities:

- Running/Jogging Mentioned several times, often combined with walking
- Commuting Used as a transportation route, including walking to/from school
- Multi-purpose use Many respondents combine walking with biking or running


Specific Mentions:

- Stair climbing One respondent specifically mentioned using trail stairs for exercise
- Photography Occasional recreational photography while walking
- Nature walking Focused on enjoying the natural environment
- Shortcut/Transportation Trail used as a practical route to destinations like parks or connecting to other trails

Key Insights: The trail functions primarily as a walking corridor, with dog walking being a major driver of regular usage. There's significant interest in biking, with one respondent noting they "would love to use my bike," suggesting potential for increased cycling if conditions were improved. The trail serves dual purposes as both a recreational space and a practical transportation route for the community.



Q8 How close do you live to the trail?



Q9 How often do you use one of the trails?




Q10 When do you typically use the trail?

Top Priority Issues:

Maintenance & Cleanliness

- General trail maintenance and upkeep (frequently mentioned)
- Regular mowing and weed management
- Trash cleanup along the creek
- Managing Japanese knotweed overgrowth
- Better drainage to prevent standing water and mud

Environmental Concerns

- Sewage smell and runoff issues affecting trail experience
- Creek pollution mitigation
- Industrial noise from nearby businesses

Infrastructure Improvements

Seating & Rest Areas

- Benches along the trail, especially overlooking the creek
- Rest areas and waystations

Trail Surface & Accessibility

- Better footing/surface (preference for crushed gravel over pavement)
- Improved bike-friendly surfaces
- Handicapped accessibility
- Better drainage design

Connectivity & Navigation

- Connections to other trail networks (Panhandle, Clearview, Pittsburgh trails)
- Better signage and trail information
- Online trail information and maps

Amenities

- Garbage cans
- Porta-johns/bathrooms
- Water fountains
- Parking improvements

Safety & Security

- Security cameras and call boxes
- Vehicle access control (preventing unauthorized motor vehicle use)
- Leash law enforcement for dogs

Nature Enhancement

- Wildlife habitat improvements
- Educational signage about history and nature
- Bird-watching features
- Pollinator beds


Notable Preferences:

- Strong preference for keeping trails natural rather than heavily developed
- Mixed opinions on lighting (some want it, others prefer dark sky preservation)
- Emphasis on basic maintenance over major infrastructure projects

Awareness Issue: Several respondents noted they didn't know the trails existed, indicating a need for better promotion and signage.

Infrastructure & Safety

- Emergency features: 911 call buttons, emergency vehicle access
- Mile markers for distance tracking
- Bike racks at trailheads (preferred over making trails bikeable)
- Parking improvements

Sanitation & Waste Management

- Bathrooms/toilets (frequently requested)
- Trash cans, especially at trail entrances like Crafton Blvd
- Pet waste stations throughout the community and trails

Connectivity & Access

- Connections to other trail networks
- Bridge connecting trail across creek to Thornburg
- Integration with borough-wide stair/walking plan (Chess Street stairs, Clearview to Barr stairs)

Environmental & Maintenance

- Bioswales for stormwater management
- Poison ivy/oak removal
- Better edging and grass cutting
- Dark sky compliant lighting (warmer color temperature) if lighting is added

Recreation Features

- Fenced off-leash dog area (like Bark Park in Upper St. Clair)
- Bird watching area designation for Baker's Acres
- Exercise stations (positive feedback on this idea)

Strong Opposition Themes

- "Keep it natural" Multiple respondents want minimal development
- No paving/asphalt concerns about drainage and environmental impact
- No lighting concerns about light pollution
- No over-development some residents prefer current natural state

Enforcement Needs

- Motor vehicle enforcement (motorcycles, quads, unauthorized vehicles)
- Leash law enforcement for dogs


Alternative Suggestions

- Connect to existing facilities (Meyer Middleton) rather than adding new amenities
- Focus on accessibility to emergency vehicles rather than general vehicle access

Notable Sentiment: There's a clear divide between those wanting more amenities and those preferring to keep the trails in their current natural state, with several emphatic responses against additional development due to tax concerns and environmental preservation preferences.

Question 16

Most Frequently Mentioned Areas of Concern:

Ewing Road - Multiple residents cited safety concerns, particularly between Promenade and Jerry James Way, with issues including speeding baseball traffic, broken streetlights, and poor visibility.

Creek/Trail Areas - Several respondents mentioned feeling unsafe on trails alone, particularly the Chartiers Creek area and connecting trails, citing darkness, overgrowth, and lack of lighting.

Crafton Boulevard/Oakwood Road Crossing - This intersection was mentioned multiple times as problematic for pedestrians.

Primary Safety Issues Identified:

Traffic and Speeding - Frequent concerns about fast-moving vehicles on Fountain Street, Chartiers Street, Noble Avenue, and Steuben Street, especially during commute times and around baseball fields.

Poor Lighting - Multiple mentions of inadequate street lighting, particularly on trails and side streets at night.

Sidewalk Conditions - Broken, cracked, and uneven sidewalks throughout the community, with specific mentions of the McMunn/Elm area and missing sidewalks on Backbone Road and Township Road.

Trail Maintenance - Overgrown vegetation, muddy conditions, and poor maintenance of steps (particularly Taylor Street steps) and trail access points.

Connectivity Desires:

Residents expressed wanting better connections to neighboring communities (Ingram, Carnegie, Oakwood) and extensions of existing trails, particularly the Chartiers Creek Trail.


Notable Positive Feedback:

Several residents emphasized that Crafton generally feels very safe and walkable, with specific praise for Thornburg Park accessibility. A few respondents stated they feel safe everywhere in the community.

The responses suggest that while Crafton is generally viewed as a safe walking community, improvements in lighting, traffic calming, sidewalk maintenance, and trail connectivity would enhance the pedestrian experience.
