Dear West Monument Avenue Residents:

Thank you for attending our town hall on April 1, 2026, as well as sending over a petition to install temporary speed bumps on your street. At Borough Council's April 27, 2026 meeting, Council authorized staff to install temporary speed bumps on West Monument Avenue.

The Borough already owns these temporary speed bumps and is working to determine a location for the installation. The Borough has also ordered the required signage which will need to be placed on West Monument Avenue to warn drivers about the temporary speed bumps.

Once the signs are received, the Borough of Hatboro Public Works Department will install the signage and temporary speed bumps. The Borough will also begin posting information on our media outlets informing motorists of their installation.

As noted during the town hall, these temporary speed bumps can be noisy and we want to remind residents that while these bumps can slow traffic, there may be additional noise from vehicles traveling on West Monument Avenue. Because of this, these temporary bumps are not typically used on residential streets. The Borough is willing to try to see if these bumps help with the increased traffic on West Monument Avenue because of the petition received and the traffic data collected in the area.

The Hatboro Police Department will continue traffic enforcement on West Monument Avenue and surrounding streets. The Borough encourages residents to call 9-1-1 when you see traffic violations or if you have concerns so an officer can respond to investigate.

In addition to the addition of the speed bumps, the Borough has the following updates to share with residents of West Monument Avenue:

The Borough has been sharing monthly updates on the progress of the West Moreland Avenue bridge project. Montgomery County has indicated that the issue with Verizon has since been rectified and that the work is progressing at this time. The Borough also reached out to the County, State, and Federal Representatives regarding this project and relayed comments/concerns made during the town hall meeting to ensure residents' voices are heard. The County also regularly updates their Bridge Project portion of their website with information on the project's status and will continue to do so throughout the project duration.

The 2026 pool season is less than a month away. As you are aware, pool patrons will be utilizing the parking in the rear of the Memorial Park/Pool (West Monument Avenue Stone Lot). All members have been advised to remember to follow all traffic regulations when driving in the neighborhood to get to the pool. The Borough has

also placed information regarding traffic and pool access on membership/guest materials for this season as an added reminder for patrons.

Staff continues to work with the Borough Engineer on securing the supplies needed to make the repairs to the West Monument Avenue Bridge. Please stay tuned to Council agendas, the Borough website, Borough Facebook page, and Savvy Citizen for updates on when this work will be performed. As a reminder, this work will require the West Monument Avenue Bridge to be closed for approximately 24-48 hours.
