Chief Turner: Thank Jim for helping and fixing the signs at WARP.

WARP has been receiving threats- ongoing investigation and the State Police are involved.

Joe Dombroski: He resides at 160 E Eight Street, been there for 25 years. He has a safety concern for his property. The poles on Eight Street have been hit several times. He is requesting a Ballard be placed on the tree lawn for peace of mind.

Paul Konopka: The taxes are now at Face Value and 81% of the collection has been paid to date.

Mary Jean Petroski: She has lived on Breese Street for 53 years and she is waiting to see what will be done at 16 Breese Street. It is a fire hazard. She had to put up a fence because of the junk vehicles, and garbage. Code enforcement has been there but no results.

Tom Skilonger: He has the same issue with 16 Breese Street.

James Zarra & Kelly Brey: Spoke with the council regarding PA American Water is looking to purchase the borough's sewer system.

Michael Supey: From Next Step Supports 913 Wyoming Ave. Asked the borough is we would support local children on the spectrum to allow them to work in the borough for 8 weeks. They will have a life coach, and this is funded by the state. This would be Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday for 15 hours a week for 8 weeks
