

over the last 5 years we have worked tirelessly to improve borough government to be more efficient, responsive, and inclusive. We updated our facilities to be forward looking so we can remain independent for years to come.

We added a municipal parking lot and impound lot which generates revenue. This revenue offsets the cost to purchase our Public Works Complex. It also helps clean up our streets and make parking more readily available for residents.

We kicked off the year with a focus on public safety and grant funding for infrastructure improvements.

- Over \$100,000 in CDBG funds for Hokes Run
- Over \$106,000 in recycling grant funds
- Over \$20,000 in CDBG Funds for a Master Park Plan
- Over 10,000 in Pedestrian and traffic safety grant funding for 2024 and \$145,000 for public safety in 2023

We are also applying for a vast array of state and federal funds for public safety upgrades and park and rec funding.

We refined borough services and added new technology while studying additional improvements and the overall quality of life. The Savvycitizenapp has transformed our ability to notify residents of emergencies, and other community news and notifications such as traffic and parking restrictions.

We have focused on redevelopment and new businesses. We have big changes coming including the continued redevelopment of the Pfaltzgraf complex and South Sumner Street and Market Street. We will see a new climate controlled self storage building by StoreSpace. We also have seen the addition of amazing new business like Fire Life Yoga and La Michoacana Mexican Ice Cream. We look forward to more redevelopment in 2024.

We put a new focus on code enforcement and cleaning up our neighborhoods to make them safer

and more pleasant to live in every day. Including the rehabilitation of blighted properties vacant for decades. The focus on rental safety keeps our neighborhoods safer and reduces the risk of fire and injury. It also helps keep property values for plummeting. We even rolled out positive reinforcement in our Curb Appeal Program which recognizes beautifully kept properties.

The Borough Manager participates in working with several Committees such as the YAMPO Bike and Pedestrian Safety committee and YCSWM Regional Committee. We have also made a commitment to training to better our team. And the services we provide This includes Penndot LDAP trainings to conduct minor traffic studies on our borough streets

We are proud of the relationships we are building too. This year we continued to partner with outside stakeholders to clean up our parks and streets. A huge thanks to York College, West York Area Football, Giant Foods., and the WY VFW. Your volunteerism was appreciated. We also value individuals and organizations, business that donate to our annual events. Your generosity helps make the borough a more energetic and inviting place to live and do business

We look forward to planning and celebrating our country with America 250. and the nation's organized birthday party.

Our 2024 budget is a great compromise to end the year. It respects residents by being mindful of tax increases while not cutting public safety or general government services. It is another step in being debt free in 2026 and curing budget deficits.

I look forward to working together to make this borough a place everyone can be proud to call home or start a new business. We can't do this alone we need your help to be a good neighbor and get involved to making West York Borough safer, happier, and healthier.

A Word from the Chief

Welcome to the 2023 edition of the West York

Borough Newsletter. Recently, in partnership with York College, the police department conducted a community survey to determine the concerns of Borough residents from a police standpoint. This survey was well received

One of the biggest concerns related to juveniles in the Borough, and as I mentioned last year, through grant funding we created a juvenile engagement unit in which one of our officers is assigned to work exclusively with our youth to mentor them and hold them accountable.

We continued to prioritize the major concerns of our residents, and I am pleased to tell you that this year we were able to create two new units to address your concerns

First, we have established a traffic safety officer who is responsible for conducting full-time traffic enforcement on our roads and streets. This officer utilizes a variety of enforcement tools everyday to ensure that the motoring public is safe, and that violators of the motor vehicle code are stopped and, in many cases, cited. The modification of driver behavior and prevention of aggressive driving are of utmost importance. This officer also enforces parking regulations, assists our parking enforcement team (Highway Department & Brough Manager) and investigates accidents. Many of our traffic details are grant funded due to our commitment to traffic safety.

Second, we have created a nuisance abatement squad and assigned an officer to it. This officer patrols the neighborhoods, primarily on foot, dealing with quality-of-life issues such as abandoned vehicles, property maintenance codes, and other issues that lead to blight and deterioration of our community. This officer also works closely with our Fire Inspectors ensuring that rental properties are being maintained in a safe manner for the residents.

We are also proud to announce a new arrival into the department and Borough for 2023, and that is our new, four-legged officer, K-9 Beau. Beau is a close to one-year-old bloodhound and has been trained to track individuals, especially lost & missing children. Beau is assigned to the York Child Abduction Response Team (continued)

and was obtained through donations by community groups and area businesses. He will meet his Pennsylvania State Police certification standards this November (2023). Our Mayor, as well as the BARK Organization were integral in helping us obtain K-9 Beau.

Our patrol force and our investigator continue to handle on average twenty (20) calls for service a day. Many don't realize that our minimum shift manning brings two (2) officers on duty per shift. Many of the calls that we handle are domestic related disturbances, as well as calls for assaults. Additionally, we have seen an increase in burglaries occurring in the Borough, especially to some of our businesses. I am happy to report that we are making arrests in most of those cases. We have also tasked officers to focus on illegal possession of weapons and drugs coming into West York and have made several high-profile arrests. We also continue to maintain a 100% closure rate in cases involving gun violence for the year. We have prioritized training for our officers, having: advanced homicide investigation, active shooter / school shooter training, and deescalation training, been made available to them this year. We must constantly focus on ensuring that our officers are prepared to handle all situations in which they are called to.

In July, our Detective Lieutenant was honored with an award by the York County DA's Office for outstanding service, our Chief was recognized for Small Agency Leadership, a Senior Patrolman set an all time world record in powerlifting sports, our Juvenile Engagement Officer was recognized for fostering growth among area youth, and two of our patrolman who are part of the York County QRT (SWAT) Team received promotions and recognition within team ranks. Additionally, the Chief was asked to oversee law enforcement program management for the York Coalition on Homelessness. I continue to be proud of this department, where we will always focus on our residents, the Constitution, and the law to guide us in the protection and guardianship of the Borough. Please know that every day, we are fighting for you, and feel blessed by your support.




