Getting care in a disaster or emergency

Rules for getting health care may change for a short time if one of these happens in your area:

- The President declares an emergency or disaster. Visit <u>Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)</u> or call 1-800-621-FEMA (1-800-621-3362) for a list of impacted areas. TTY users can call 1-800-462-7585.
- The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Service (HHS) declares a public health emergency. Visit <u>Public Health</u> <u>Emergency</u> or call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) for a list of impacted areas.
- A governor declares an emergency or disaster. Visit your state government's official website to find out if your area is affected.

Getting chemotherapy or other cancer treatments
Replacing lost or damaged durable medical equipment or supplies
Paying your premium
Replacing a lost or damaged card
