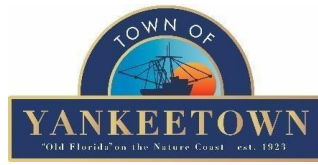

**Overview**

Animal Control responded to a variety of calls throughout April 2026 involving domestic animals, feral cat management, wildlife assistance, and owner reunification. Efforts focused on public safety, animal welfare, and population control through trapping and sterilization programs.

**Activity Summary**

**Feral Cat Management and Trapping**

- Multiple residents requested assistance with feral cat populations.
- Traps were issued and set at various locations, including 6611 Lake Avenue.
- A total of **several feral cats were successfully trapped, sterilized, and released.**
- Ongoing coordination with residents for scheduling spay and neuter services.
- Follow-up visits conducted for trap monitoring and animal transport.

**Kitten Rescue and Intake**

- Responded to reports of abandoned or trapped kittens.
- **At least 4 kittens were recovered** from trap locations and transported to shelter facilities.
- Additional kittens were scheduled for pickup and care.

**Wildlife Response**

- Responded to a report of a deceased deer with a nearby fawn.
- **Fawn was safely rescued and transferred to a wildlife rehabilitation facility.**

**Domestic Animal Assistance**

- Assisted with a report of a stray dog near a dock.
- Dog was safely secured and transported to Animal Control.
- Owner later reclaimed the dog and was advised to comply with rabies vaccination and town licensing requirements.

**Public Assistance**

- Provided residents with:
  - Animal traps for feral cat control
  - Cat food assistance when requested
- Continued support for low-income residents with partial assistance for spay and neuter services.

## **Key Outcomes**

- Improved control of feral cat populations through trapping and sterilization.
- Safe recovery and placement of kittens and wildlife.
- Successful reunification of lost pets with owners.
- Continued community engagement and support for responsible pet ownership.
