## Cumberland Township New Municipal Building and Police Station Nearing Completion



Cumberland Township officials, community representatives, and project partners gathered on Friday to recognize a major construction milestone of the new Cumberland Township Municipal Building and Police Station, a project designed to modernize municipal operations and enhance public safety services for residents.

Shaun Phiel, Chair of the Cumberland Township Board of Supervisors, opened the event with the following remarks: “We have been fortunate to receive strong support for this project from Senator Mastriano, Representative Moul, our County Commissioners, community partners, and township staff and residents. The previous building served the Cumberland Township police, staff, and residents for forty-five plus years. Over its years of existence, the building had been modified slightly to meet the needs of the police, the residents, and the staff - but the time had come for a generational renovation.”

The event provided an opportunity to review project progress, recognize contractors and design teams, and outline the remaining phases of construction ahead of the facility’s anticipated completion. Once finished, the building will consolidate municipal offices and police operations into a single, purpose-built facility intended to improve efficiency, accessibility, and emergency response capabilities.

“The Township extends its appreciation for all the planning and efforts to see a solution to an over two-decade challenge for our police department and township operations”, said David Blocher, township manager. “This project would not have been possible without the injection of \$2.1 million in Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program and Local Share Account funding. This funding the Township received was a direct result of the tireless efforts of Senator Mastriano and brought this long-term vision into reality.”

During the milestone event, township officials also presented a formal proclamation of appreciation recognizing State Senator Doug Mastriano for his role in supporting efforts related to securing public grant funding for the project.

In accepting the honor, Senator Mastriano praised the township’s leadership and progress, saying “I am excited to see this come to life. You have done magnificent work, especially with being under budget - that is outstanding. I could not be more proud of the work you have done. I am humbled and honored for this, thank you.”

Construction is progressing on schedule, with interior build-out, systems installation, and site improvements currently underway. The new municipal building and police station will be completed in April, and is expected to serve the township for decades, providing modern workspaces, improved public access, and enhanced capabilities for public safety personnel.

## **Building Renovation is On Track and Under Budget!**



# From the Maintenance Department...

**Happy Spring!** After a busy and active winter season, we are eager to welcome warmer weather and sunshine. Spring and summer are some of the most active times for the Cumberland Township Maintenance Department, with many scheduled maintenance routines and improvement projects underway.

## **Street Sweeping & Anti-Skid Cleanup – Late March**

Beginning in late March, the Township will conduct street sweeping and anti-skid cleanup. This effort helps remove winter sediment and prevents debris from entering storm sewer facilities. Our crews will work in cooperation with Gettysburg Borough and their street sweeper, hauling collected material to designated stockpile areas.

## **Vegetation & Visibility Maintenance**

Throughout the spring, crews will also clear trees, limbs, and vegetation that may block traffic signs or limit sight distance near intersections. Keeping these areas clear is essential for public safety.

## **Shoulder Cutting & Roadway Drainage Prep**

We will begin the season with shoulder cutting in preparation for upcoming road projects. This is the first step in our summer seal-coating program. Removing built-up soil and sediment along the road shoulders and ditch lines allows stormwater to drain properly, helping to protect and extend the life of our roadways.

## **Roadside Mowing – Ongoing**

Roadside mowing will continue throughout the growing season. This is a daily, ongoing operation. Please use caution when approaching mowing equipment—the tractor moves slowly, and the operator must manage several responsibilities at once. For everyone's safety, maintain a safe distance when traveling near mowing operations.

## **Upcoming Projects**

This season, the Maintenance Department has several major projects planned, including:

Bridge restoration on Blackhorse Tavern Road

Paving projects

Seal coating and cape seals

Pipe replacements

Base repairs to prepare for future roadway improvements



## Storm Water News

### Own a Rain Barrel



***Spring is a perfect time to think about stormwater which flows off of your roof, and how to capture that water for use later when drier summer weather arrives. An easy tool for this purpose is a rain barrel. Fully assembled barrels are available from the Conservation District office (670 Old Harrisburg Rd, Gettysburg) for \$53 (check or cash only).***

***Use a rain barrel safely and efficiently by following these tips:***

- Consider the roof area being drained by the downspout you are connecting to. A large roof may require more than one barrel during a lengthy and intense storm. Rain barrels can be connected to each other to increase capacity.***
- Ensure that your barrel is installed on a stable base to prevent it from tipping over. An elevated base makes it easier to drain the barrel during use.***
- Collected stormwater should be used for outdoor watering purposes only, not as a drinking water supply for humans or animals.***
- Place your barrel in a location where you can direct the attached hose away from your foundation in case of overflow.***
- Empty your barrel and disconnect it during the winter to prevent damage from freezing.***


