Now through Wednesday June 25, 2025


Next Update: By 6AM Tuesday June 24, 2025

Key Messages

- A dangerous heat wave will peak today and continue into midweek.
- Heat index values over 100°F and very mild overnight temperatures will lead to an increased risk of heat-related illness.
- Increasing chances for showers and thunderstorms for the second half of the week will gradually break the heatwave.

- → Updated heat index and minimum temperature maps.
- → Additional details about storm chances by midweek.



Heat Watches, Warnings, and Advisories


Valid: Today (June 23, 2025)




- An Extreme Heat Warning remains in effect for the Middle and Lower Susquehanna Valley today.
- A Heat Advisory remains in effect for the rest of Central Pennsylvania.
- Today will be the hottest day of the week.

Maximum Heat Index Values Monday: Mid-90s across the Allegheny Plateau, exceeding 105°F across the Susquehanna Valley.




Low Temperatures Monday Night: Upper 60s across north-central Pennsylvania to the upper 70s across the Lower Susquehanna Valley.

Valid: Tuesday (June 24, 2025)





- The Extreme Heat Warning will continue for the Lower Susquehanna Valley on Tuesday.
- A Heat Advisory will remain in effect for the rest of Central Pennsylvania.
- An isolated thunderstorm is possible Tuesday afternoon.




Heat Index/Low Temperature Forecast

Tuesday and Tuesday Night








Low Temperatures Tuesday Night: Upper 60s across the Allegheny Plateau to the mid-to-upper 70s across the Lower Susquehanna Valley.





Heat Watches, Warnings, and Advisories

Valid: Wednesday (June 25, 2025)




- The Extreme Heat Warning and Heat Advisory are set to expire at 8PM Wednesday.
- Thunderstorms will be more widespread on Wednesday and could limit the risk of dangerous heat.
- Heat products may be trimmed back if confidence in lower temperatures and heat index values continues to increase.




Heat Index/Low Temperature Forecast

Maximum Heat Index Values on Wednesday: Upper 80s across north-central Pennsylvania, naer 100°F across the Lower Susquehanna Valley.



Low Temperatures Wednesday Night: Mid-to-upper 60s across north-central Pennsylvania to the mid-70s across the Lower Susquehanna Valley.




Storm Chances Up, Temperatures Down


Later This Week
