It's been a great year overall for the Hellam Township Public Works Department. Working with our residents and contractors on various projects has proved to be very productive and smooth 2023 Public Works season. Thank you for your continued support-Curt Ferree, Public Works Roadmaster

As we look back at 2023, here are some projects that were completed:

- Pipe Replacements and upgrades on Wallicks Road, Range Road, and Trout Run Road
- Paving of the remainder of Range Road and Trout Run Road to the Springettsbury Twp line
- Crack sealing; approximately 3 tons of material was applied to Township roads over the course of a twoweek period this Fall
- Line painting, including approximately 5 miles of double-yellow line were applied as well

Looking forward to 2024, we've tentatively planned our schedule to include:

- · Chip sealing
- Additional pipe replacement
- Street sweeping, as needed, beginning sometime in the Spring, weather permitting
- Mowing will continue, as needed, beginning sometime in May, weather permitting
- Purchasing a 2023 CAT backhoe to replace the 2007 model currently in use

As we move further into the winter season, here are some reminders:

- · Don't forget to put out yard markers which helps our plow truck drivers during snow storms
- Please try to be patient as we clear the TOWNSHIP ROADS, and do your best to give the plow trucks plenty of room to keep the roads as safe as possible for everyone
- We do not provide leaf collection, however we do collect leaves in several of our open waterways, storm boxes, and heavy tree canopy areas, to prevent flooding



Thank you to the residents who have continued to bring used oil throughout the winter season. The Public Works Department will continue to accept used oil throughout the year. Please contact the Township to arrange drop-off with the Road Master, by calling 717-434-1300.

Applying For A Permit

To begin, you must fill out a zoning permit application and a building application, if applicable, that should include the signature of the property owner. Please include a drawing of your proposed improvement, showing setbacks, building dimensions, and lot coverage, including driveways. Please submit the completed applications either in-person at the Township building, via standard mail, or by emailing the forms to zoning@hellamtownship.com. You must pay the application fees in order for your permit to begin the review process.

Fees

For all Building & Zoning permits, there is a \$25 non-refundable application fee, with payment due at the time of submittal. Your application will be reviewed, and if there are any questions, the Zoning Officer will contact you. Please be sure all contact information is submitted and accurate. The Zoning Permit fee is listed on the Township Fee Schedule. It is currently \$8 per \$1,000 spent on the construction costs, and is subject to change upon annual review. There is also a \$25 fee for Use & Occupancy certificates. All fees are payable upon permit pick-up.

Building Permits

Our primary, third-party, inspection service is Commonwealth Code Inspection Service, Inc. (CCIS). We do offer a secondary inspection service for the convenience of our residents; Building Inspection Underwriters, Inc. (BIU). If a building permit is required, we will forward it to the inspection servicer selected by the applicant. After the Township submits the building permit to your chosen inspector, the application will be reviewed and/or approved by CCIS or BIU. You must contact he building inspector directly to arrange the inspections. Once complete, the Zoning Officer will contact you regarding the final fees due. The fees associated with Building Permits are billed by the third-party inspection service, which you will receive an itemized invoice with the permit packet at time of pick-up. Once the Building Permit is completed, you can pick it up, along with your zoning permit, if applicable. All fees are due upon pick-up.

Payments

We accept cash and checks for zoning permits payments; which checks are payable to Hellam Township. Payment for building permits is payable to the specific third-party inspection service utilized, either Commonwealth Code Inspection Services, Inc. (CCIS) or Building Inspection Underwriters, Inc. (BIU). At this time, cash is not an acceptable form of payment for building permits. The permit process on average takes 10-14 business days to complete. You must allow for this time when scheduling your project, as no work may begin until the appropriate permits are acquired.

When Do I Need a Permit?

Section 490-149.A(I) of the Hellam Township Zoning Ordinance dictates when a zoning permit is required.

Permits are required when:

- There is a change in use of land or structure.
 - For example, you want to run a day care out of your home or you want to convert your basement into a separate dwelling unit, you need a permit.
 - The type of permit required for a change of use is called a "use and occupancy" or "certificate of occupancy."
- · The erection, construction, improvement or alteration of any structure or portion thereof.
 - For example, if you want to add a shed or swimming pool to your property, room additions, new homes, retaining walls, fences, signs and the like. The removal of structures also requires a permit even the removal of a mobile home.
 - Removal of a structure requires a zoning and demolition permit. Addition of or to structures requires a zoning permit and depending on the size may require a building permit and a stormwater management permit.
 - Any addition of impervious area, 500 square feet or more requires stormwater management. Hellam Township considers gravel impervious.
- Alteration or development of any ground or land.
 - This includes mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations.
 - Any well needs a permit. Brush removal that exposes the dirt needs a permit. Driveways, new or resurfacing need a permit.

Permits are not required for vinyl siding, replacing windows and doors (as long as the framing is not altered) and landscaping. If you have a question about the need for a permit, call Zoning Officer Jason Test at 717-434-1300.

Possible Zoning Ordinance Revisions

Listed below is a summary of each topic discussed for possible ordinance amendment or enactments. Review begins with the Planning Commission then moves to the Board of Supervisors. Resident input is encouraged, so be sure to attend the meetings and interact with the surveys and digital content posted on our websites www.hellamtownship.com and www.engage.hellamtownship.com. The Planning Commission meets the second and fourth Thursday of every month starting at 6:00 PM. Stay informed, attend a meeting! If you cannot attend a meeting in person, you can attend on Zoom. The Zoom log in information along with agendas and packet items are generally posted on the website one week in advance.

River Lands Zone: On December 8, 2022 the Planning Commission began evaluating the possibility of creating a River Lands Zone and assessing possible properties to include in this Zone. The purpose of creating this zone would be to evaluate the uniqueness of properties along the river, to assess setbacks and to expand upon outdoor recreational opportunities, as more land has been acquired by Lancaster County Conservancy and PA DCNR.

Short Term Rentals: In 2023 the Township began addressing ways to regulate short term rentals (STRs), commonly referred to as Airbnb's & VRBO's. At the December 7, 2023 Board of Supervisors meeting, after many months of review and revision, the Public Hearing for the Short-Term Rental Ordinance No. 2023-01 went before the Board of Supervisors for and was approved unanimously.

Solar Facilities: The Township is currently evaluating regulations already in place for large-scale and small-scale solar facilities, to determine if any additional regulations are necessary. A resident survey on the topic will be launched on www.engage.hellamtownship. com in early 2024. We urge you to participate!

In 2023, the Township waste hauler contract went out to bid. The bid was awarded to Republic Services, as they were the only waste hauler who submitted a bid for consideration. The contract is for a 3-year term, and was effective beginning October 1, 2023. The pricing for the next 3 years is as follows:

October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024: \$89.85/Per quarter

October 1, 2024 - September 30, 2025: \$96.14/Per quarter

October 1, 2025 - September 30, 2026: \$102.87/Per quarter

These rates include once weekly trash & recycling pickup, utilizing 96-gallon trash toters and 64-gallon recycling toters, provided by Republic Services. Low-volume trash service is no longer provided. These rates also include bulk item pickup, which can be scheduled once weekly by contacting Republic Services **directly** to arrange pick-up at 800-210-9675, and Christmas tree pickup once per year, in January.

About EYRA

Eastern York Recreation Authority (EYRA) was founded in 2018 by a grant awarded by the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Bureau of Recreation & Conservation. Three (of six) municipalities within the small, rural Eastern York School District applied for funding to hire a full-time Parks & Recreation Director to serve their communities. The first director took the reins in November 2018, reporting to a six-member, all-volunteer board, which is comprised of 1 Board/Council member and 1 resident-at-large for each participating Municipality. In October 2021, a part-time Sport & Facilities Coordinator was hired.

EYRA was formed to 1) jointly operate educational, recreational, and athletic programs and facilities to economically meet the present and future parks and recreation needs of Hellam Township, Lower Windsor Township, and Hallam Borough residents, and 2) operate, strengthen, and expand the community recreation programs formerly provided by the Hellam Recreation Commission.

We continually seek to improve our operations and develop our programming for the area's 20,000 residents. Our goal is to create recreational opportunities for growth and enhancement by developing an array of diverse, affordable programs and events that promote community service and environmental awareness, while meeting the physical, mental, social, and psychological needs of our community.
