

Could health hazards be hiding in and around your home?

The goal of Healthy Homes is to create a strong pathway to curb the impact of health issues caused or worsened by hazards in the home- leading to healthier families and communities.

How can the Healthy Homes program help my family?

- Educational materials about home health hazards such as:
 - Mold & Moisture
 - Radon
 - Burns & Scalds
 - Fall Risks
 - Household Pests
- Free home health hazards assessment conducted by a trained Healthy Homes Specialist
- Free funds to help address your home's health hazards with the support of licensed contractors

How do I know if my family qualifies for help from Healthy Homes?

- You must own your home and it must be located in certain areas of Lancaster County

AND

- Your household income must fall at or below 80% of the area median income

AND

- Homes of all ages may qualify but if your home was built before 1978 your home may require additional testing



If we qualify for the program, what would happen next?

You will work with our Intake Coordinator or Healthy Homes Specialist to submit all your paperwork. Then you will choose a time to have your home health hazard assessment completed. Finally, your home's health hazards will be prioritized based on available funding and addressed by licensed contractors.
