

## **CRAFTON POOL BATHHOUSE RENOVATION UNVEILED**

We were thrilled to announce the grand opening of the newly renovated bathhouse at Crafton Pool in Crafton Park. This exciting project, which enhances our community's recreational facilities, was made possible through a collaborative effort and generous funding support.

The renovated bathhouse officially opened its doors to the public on Saturday, May 25th, just in time for the summer season. A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on Thursday, May 23rd, to commemorate this significant milestone for our community.

The \$600,000 renovation project was partially funded by a \$250,000 grant from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR). We extend our heartfelt gratitude to State Representative Dan Deasy and State Senator Wayne Fontana for their instrumental role in securing these funds.

The renovated bathhouse features three ADA accessible bathrooms and showers, a family restroom for those who desire more privacy, and a hallway that connects directly to the pool, allowing patrons to forgo the changing rooms. There is also increased video security presence, and updated sound system, new lockers, and other new amenities as well. If you have not yet had a chance to visit, please come before we close on Labor Day weekend.

## **Council President's Message**

As we prepare for year end, there is a lot going on in our borough, continuing to move us forward. Since the last newsletter, we have quite a few accomplishments including:

- 1. Pool Bathhouse Renovation Construction was completed in May on schedule, and the pool opened Memorial Day weekend.
- Board/Commission Vacancies All positions are filled with Recreation and Zoning Hearing openings 2. occurring later this year.
- З. Police CBA Contract - With the retirement of the Police Chief this year, the current contract was extended one more year.
- 4. Community & Economic Development Director hired – Mike Tedesco started in April with a focus on attracting businesses and developing the amenities of our community.
- 5. 2024 Banner Community - Awarded from Allegheny League of Municipalities for our commitment to sustainable practices including professional development, intergovernmental cooperation, sound fiscal management and proactive communications to engage community stakeholders with transparency and accountability.

6. Newsletter-updated the format and publisher to a modern look with the opportunity for local businesses to advertise.



April 27, Arbor Day Dedication

We are working on the following projects:

- 1. Garbage/Recycling Contract Bids were received in mid-July. Options are being evaluated with public comments and input vitally important to the process.
- 2. Multi Municipal Zoning Project Steering committee met several times since the public forum and will have final edits to the draft by late summer.
- 3. 2024 Road Paving Project Awarded the contract in June with paving already begun on the 8 worst roads determined by the new software Vialytics, in addition to replacing the old guardrail on Promenade.
- 4. Stairs Projects Belvidere railing replacement and Promenade to Fountain steps were completed. Work has begun on Clearview/Crafton/ Walnut stairs.

- 5. Crafton Logo With community input received, look for the unveiling of the new logo in late summer.
- Giving Grove Project Partnering with Tree Pittsburgh for a grant covering a fruit tree orchard in Crafton Park to supplement the 6. Food Bank.
- 7. 2024 Financials Mid year, the borough's finances are in line with the budget.

Our future projects include:

- Broadhead Sewer Separation Project This is a major project that will improve our sewer systems (as required by Alcosan 1. consent decree) in addition to fixing the corresponding roads with \$7M in grants awarded. Project is out to bid.
- Consent Decree for C-20 Sewer Separation Alcosan accepted the major project. The smaller projects will be submitted next 2. vear for funding.
- З. Trails Study - RFP has been submitted and meeting held with DCNR project manager.
- 4. Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) – Partnering with neighboring communities to submit the grant application at end of August.

As a reminder, Council meetings are open to the public, and I encourage residents to attend (2nd and 4th Thursday of every month at 7:00 PM) in person or via Zoom to keep up to date on what is happening in our community. If you have any questions about anything on the agenda or happening in the community, please feel free to reach out to me.

It was good seeing many of you at the Senior Dinners, Music Festival, Arbor Day/Community Clean Up, July 4th celebration, and Pool Ribbon Cutting, I look forward to the festivities planned for Fall Fest, Haunted Crafton, Celebration of Lights, and Christmas House Tour. I hope everyone enjoyed the summer and is looking forward to the first day of school and fall activities. I continue to appreciate the opportunity to serve you.

Each year, since 2005 at noon, we gather in front of the Borough Building to commemorate the Crafton residents who have given their lives defending freedom throughout the world. This year, Ralph Michelfelder was added. Ralph served in WWI and gave his life during the battle of Meuse-Argonne. 104 names were read and the number of times the bell tolled. The memorial was erected after WWII. The plaque was added through the efforts of the American Legion in 2005.

I am always acutely aware of how much I, personally, have to be grateful for, as I step forward

to read the names assigned to me. (My mother was an 8-year-old refugee to France from Belgium at the start of WWII in 1940. My father met her years later while serving in the Air Force in France during the time of the Korean War in the early 50s.)

On a more upbeat note - it was incredibly rewarding to take part in the ribbon cutting ceremony for the updated pool bathhouse. It's wonderful to see the community enjoying the fruits of several long years of planning and the final building.

#### **Police Chief Search Commences**

Chief Mark Sumpter, who has served Crafton for 45 years, will be retiring at the end of this year. His are mighty big shoes to fill.

Council and I are committed to finding the best possible leader for our department and for the community. We also want to ensure a fair and impartial process. Council has appointed council members Michael Hough, Colton Chandler, and me to the search committee. Council agreed to retain the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association to assist with our search and to guide us through the entire process at the recommendation of the committee.

Rest assured, we are starting the search at home by guaranteeing any current officer who applied for the position an automatic interview.

The position was advertised on the Chiefs Association's job site. The site reaches across the state and beyond. It was also be posted on other regional boards. The applications closed on July 19. By the time you are reading this, they will have reviewed all submissions and will have made their top six recommendations to Council for initial interviews. Council will conduct the final interviews of the top two or three candidates and will make the final decision by majority vote at an open council meeting in the near future.

# State Senator Wayne Fontana, 42nd Senatorial District

Between 17 brick-and-mortar casinos, 21 online casinos and 13 sports betting operators, the gaming industry in Pennsylvania set an overall gambling revenue record of nearly \$5.7 billion last year. But this form of entertainment is also highly addictive. Research indicates that almost 6 million Americans struggle with a gambling disorder.

To help combat this growing problem, earlier this year I introduced Senate Bill 1159, legislation that would prohibit the use of credit cards for iLottery, online casino games, sports betting and fantasy sports.

Most adults in the United States have placed some type of gaming bet, and most do it without problems. But a significant subset of people who start gambling go on to develop a gambling disorder. Since the expansion of online gaming and sports wagering in Pennsylvania nearly seven years ago, there is greater access to gambling which in turn increases the number of individuals who may develop a gambling disorder.

According to a 2022 Online Gaming Report produced by Pennsylvania State University, in coordination with the Pennsylvania Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs as well as the state's Gaming Control Board, over 36 percent of online gaming participants in the commonwealth reported at least one gambling problem.

Gambling and credit card debt often go hand in hand. The ease and convenience of being able to gamble from the comforts of your home or from a mobile device, any time or day, can create the perfect storm when one factors in the ability to use a credit card to do so. With high interest rates, unpredictable fees, and credit score implications, this disorder can lead to major financial problems and affect a person's ability to pay off debt.

Credit cards are the fastest rising category of household debt which has reached a record high of \$1.08 trillion nationwide. In Pennsylvania, the average credit card debt a consumer carries exceeds, \$5,600. In our region, the average balance is more than \$11,000, almost double that of the state average.

Online gaming should be enjoyed responsibly and not at the expense of taking on crippling credit card balances. States that have already outlawed credit card use for online gambling include lowa, Massachusetts, and Tennessee. My consumer protection bill will prohibit the use of credit cards for online gambling in the commonwealth and eliminate one avenue to push someone into unmanageable debt.

## Crafton to Improve Several Public Stairways

The Borough of Crafton has embarked on a major renovation project to restore and modernize a portion of its iconic public stairway system, a defining feature of the community's landscape and connectivity.

"Crafton's public stairs are more than just walkways - they are a vital part of our community fabric that connect neighborhoods and enhance quality of life," said Council President, John Oliverio. "With hundreds of vertical feet of stairways crisscrossing our borough, maintaining them is important for promoting walkability and multi-modal transit."

With a total construction cost estimated at \$585,000, Crafton is replacing the railing on the Afton to Belvidere stairs, and completely replacing the stairs from

Fountain St. to Promenade St. and from Walnut St. to Crafton Blvd. Crafton partnered with State Senator Wayne Fontana and State Representative Dan Deasy to secure \$293,911 in ARPA funding from the Redevelopment Authority of Allegheny



Public stairways are a defining part of Crafton and metropolitan Pittsburgh as a whole. Many of the region's public stairways are in a state of disrepair, and we are working to improve them. "We see our stairways just like we see our streets," said Larry Keenan, the borough's Engineer. "If a street has a pothole, we fill it. If a public staircase needs improvements, we work to improve it. Both are important for our urban fabric."

According to Mayor Coletta Perry, many of the borough's public stairways date back to the when the trolley first started running in Crafton and play a crucial role in connecting the hilly

terrain to residential areas, business districts and public transit. Regionally, it's estimated that over 24,000 vertical feet of public stairways crisscross Pittsburgh's neighborhoods and boroughs.

#### **Tree Care Reminders:**

Proper maintenance, including establishing a mulch "donut" around trees to prevent decay, is always good.
 Exercise caution when weed whacking to avoid damaging tree bases. Additionally, during extended
 drought or hot weather, young or less established trees may require extra watering to survive.

Please note, according to borough ordinance, street trees require permission before removal or significant pruning.



Crafton Community Farm

The Crafton Community Farm in Crafton Park is not your ordinary community garden! Established in 2015, the communal garden is planted, mulched, watered, weeded and harvested by volunteers-who then donate most of the produce to Crafton Ingram Food Pantry and others.

We use the free compost from Crafton Borough, and this year our garden is looking especially beautiful.

We received a Grow Pittsburgh Sustainability grant for all the seedlings we planted, and also for 4 Cattle panel trellises, that allow squash, beans, and tomatoes to climb vertically. We welcomed some new volunteers, and have successfully continued our mission to model natural food-growing practices and to donate fresh and healthy produce to neighbors in need. We are experimenting with growing wine-cap mushrooms in the shade provided by our raspberry thicket, and we have installed more seating.









Our micro-farm produces well into the Fall, so it is not too late to get involved! We would love to see you and your family at the garden. Please check it out when you

are in Crafton Park, or come work with us on a Saturday morning, starting around 10 am, weather permitting.

Residents may request the removal and chipping of eligible tree limbs and branches by placing a service request at www. craftonborough.com/service-request. Single limbs must be less than 5 inches in diameter and no longer than 10 feet in length. Volume of materials should not exceed what could fit into a pickup truck. Materials can be either chipped onsite and removed or left for the resident upon request. **PLEASE NOTE:** Chipping limbs and branches will cause dust and may accumulate on nearby vehicles.

This service is offered from April 15th through November 15th. Collection is scheduled every other week following Crafton's regular recycle pickup.
