To whom it may concern,

The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC) will be conducting traffic counts within Forks Township on July 13th through July 16th at the following locations:

1. Frost Hollow Rd between Meadow Dr. and Key Ln
2. Zucksville Rd. between Hopkins Ln. and Biddle Ln.
3. Kesslerville Rd. approximately 600 feet north of Monticello Ave.
4. Sullivan Trail between Braden Blvd. and the entrance to Braden Airport

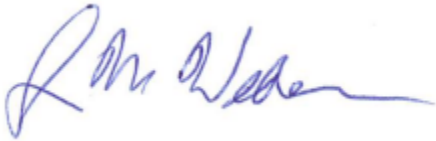
The system used to perform these counts are automated traffic recorders (ATRs) that employ pneumatic rubber tubes laid across the roadway which connect to a traffic counter. The LVPC's counters are small green boxes with the LVPC's name and phone number on them. They will always be securely attached to public property within Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) right of way. They will never be attached to private property or impede anyone's use of their property. The counters only remain deployed for 3-4 days at a time.

PennDOT contracts with the LVPC to conduct these studies every year at predetermined sites. The information gathered by these counts is used by PennDOT to support traffic planning studies. The information gathered is available to the public through PennDOT's Traffic Information Repository (TIRe) <https://gis.penndot.gov/TIRe>. The only information gathered by the ATR's is volume of traffic and, at some locations, classification into different vehicle types. The ATR's do not track vehicle speeds, and they do not gather any vehicle-specific or personal information.

Please contact us if any scheduled roadwork or street cleaning will conflict with the counts. If there is a conflict with roadway maintenance work, we will reschedule the counts. If there is a conflict with street cleaning, we would ask you to avoid cleaning on the blocks where we have ATRs, since the street sweeper is likely to lift up the hose, which will damage our equipment, and potentially the street sweeper.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the work that the LVPC is doing within your community. We also hope that this letter can be educational and provide you accurate information that you would be able to pass along to residents if concerns arise.
