

Northgate School Board Incumbent, Bill Bergmann

I was appointed to the Northgate School Board In August 2022. Prior to my appointment, I followed school board meetings because I have a child in the district. Now that I am on the board, I have a broader and deeper understanding of the district's operations, finances, and activities.

School boards generally need strong leadership to advance quality public education. As a university professor of 18 years and chair of my department, I'm familiar with challenges of budgeting and administration. I am interested in teaching methods and work with undergraduate education majors. These experiences have made it easier to understand the work of the district and challenges it faces.

It it all about the Northgate community. We have committed educators, an administration that has been recognized regionally and nationally, and a business community interested in partnering with the district for the success of our students. And we have passionate parents and community members who volunteer their time. As a member of the school board, I will work to foster the synergies that strengthen the educational and extracurricular experiences for our students.
